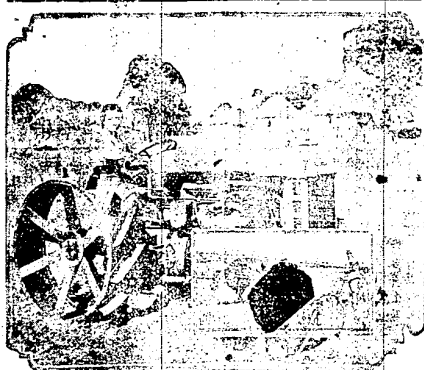

## TRACTOR SUPPLANTS OXEN IN FARMING OF FAR EAST



It is a long journey from the rich farm lands of America to the restricted farm areas of the islands but the distance has been spanned not only by the progressive implement dealers in the islands, but also by the boys and girls who come to America to school and carry home with them the ideas of the New World. From the crude, difficult methods which sufficed for their ancestors through centuries, the native farmers now have advanced to the present in power farming machinery, and the most advanced methods of making the soil produce to the utmost.

The girl in the photograph is a native help of Manila, and is shown with one of her own tractors. ## SHREWD TRICKS OF BOOTLEGGER OF BOOTLEGGER BEING RECLAIMED ARE TOLD HERE

WHISKY-SELLERS CHEAT CUSTOMERS AS WELL AS THE LAW.

That the bootlegger is a cheat as well as a law-breaker is the verdict of the Michigan State Police officers who have been engaged in fighting the illicit liquor trade in this state. It is their opinion that the greed of the men who sell whisky is such that the latter will scruple at no fraud to make money.

While the average man is cautious enough in ordinary dealings, he seems to be as credulous as a child when it comes to buying forbidden liquor. Thus he is the victim of a multitude of devices by which he buys something other than what he thinks he is paying for.

Where whisky is sold in casks or jugs, two favorite tricks are used to swindle the buyer. One calls for the use of a funnel inserted in the container. The funnel contains real liquor while the remainder of the space is filled up with some other liquid. Or a large portion of the space is filled with paraffin and then a small quantity of whisky is placed in the cavity left.

Where whisky is sold in bottles there are many devices. Everyone has heard of the soaking off of labels and the re-filling of a bottle with inferior spirits. Or a counterfeit label is used. Another trick calls for the spraying of the bottle by means of a battery, needle inserted alongside the cork and re-filling with moonshine. The electric needle is also used for emptying bottles without removing the cork.

In many cases the bootlegger does not substitute inferior whisky but merely adds water and thus makes three bottles of whisky out of one. But there is still another trick used which has a humorous tinge. The bootlegger secures a certain vegetable preparation which, when added to water, gives it the appearance and flavor of whisky but lacks the "kick." The poor deluded chap who pays from half a dollar to a dollar for a drink of this concoction is not breaking the law; he is simply being made a sucker.

However, it is the fact, as developed by the state's chemists, that the man who buys imitation whisky of watered whisky is fortunate alone side of the one who buys "moonshine." It may be that the southern mountaineers know how to make potent moonshine whisky but the Michigan distillers are sad failures and their brand of liquor is both nauseating and harmful to health.

## MARYLAND ORGANIZES STATE POLICE FORCE

The movement for better enforcement of the laws by state agency, which has resulted in the adoption of the State Police system in a number of states, has caused the formation of a modern force along the lines of the Pennsylvania constabulary in Maryland. This force is the outgrowth of the organization which has been used for highway patrol purposes and expert assistance has been rendered by officers loaned by other State Police forces.

Famous "Campagna Romana" Is Being Cultivated and Is Yielding Big Crops.

## LAYS IDLE FOR MANY YEARS

Since the fall of the Roman Empire This Once Fruitful Tract Has Been Uncultivated—To Reclaim Many Thousand Acres.

Ostia, Italy.—Efforts are being made to reclaim and plant parts of the vast tract of land which stretches for several miles around Rome and goes by the name of the "Campagna Romana." It has been allowed to remain idle and uncultivated ever since the fall of the Roman empire.

Before that time it was a sort of terrestrial paradise, with gardens dotted all over it as far as the eye could see. It was luxuriant with fruits and flowers, it supplied food and work for thousands upon thousands of men, it was one of the most beautiful and intensely cultivated spots in the world.

When Rome, however, was obliged to resign her position as "the mistress of the world," the "campagna" was abandoned and gradually became a marshy, malarial-infected desert, inhabited only by a few hardy shepherds.

## New Law Having Effect.

Now, however, the law which was recently passed, decreeing that anyone who does not cultivate his land to the utmost of its capacity, is liable to have the land confiscated, is beginning to have its effects. Prince Alessandro, has changed a company to reclaim a huge estate of several thousands of acres, which he owns in the "campagna."

The work already has begun and an experimental station has been set up at Ostia. The land was first of all drained and then arrangements were made to obtain water from the Tiber for irrigation. Electric tractors to draw the plows were then bought and various kinds of fruit, vegetables and cereals were cultivated in order to find out how fertile the land is and what kind of crop it is most adapted for.

## Yields Plentiful Crops.

The results were beyond the wildest hopes of any of the promoters of the company. The land, after lying idle for centuries, seems to have stored up its fertility throughout all that time and now yields crop upon crop with unstinting hand.

An attempt has even been made to grow cotton here and the experiment has been successful, but how successful it has been is impossible to determine, as the cottonseed used was of the worst quality obtainable. This year, however, it is proposed to plant American Egyptian cotton. So happy have the results of the experimental station been, that it is hoped that soon work may be begun for the total reclaiming of the whole of the "campagna."

## TROOPERS SERVE INJUNCTION

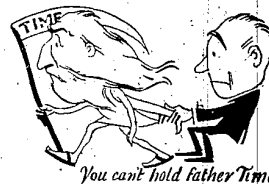
