FINANCIAL.

In spite of the fact that European countries are staggering under the load of a heavy war burden, and in spite of the fact that these foreign conditions reflect on the general prosperity of the United States; nevertheless a community such as Farmington feels such depression slightly, if at all, because of four reasons. First—The banks allow no farmer or business man to borrow more money than he in hard times can pay interest and principal thereon in a reasonable length of time; Second—The banker knows the productivity of the farms on which he loans money and he knows how much the farmer can produce on a certain farm. He likewise judges the various points of businesses from both the economic and personal sides. Thirdly—Farmington is inhabited by honest, industrious and lawabiding citizens, who live within their means and pay their debts. Fourthly—Farmington is located close to the large and fast growing city of Detroit. Prominent citizens have estimated that today one hundred homes could be rented in Farmington if they were of the right type.

Each and every day hundreds of pounds of milk are hauled to the city of Detroit, which milk gives the producer a neat revenue. In both good and bad times the people of Detroit will demand milk. Hence the farmer always will have a market for all farm produce. In fact Detroit furnishes a ready market for all farm produce. Some may say that prices are extremely low on market products at the present time but we hear of no farmers in the Detroit area letting their crops rot which has happened in the past six months in many parts of the United States.

Farmington offers up ideal home site for people in moderate circumstances and the Goers and others are going to make their subdivisions available for these newcomers.

Our major premise is that over-

extension of credits in various industries plus the European situation has tied up the money market, hence business slows down. This situation does not prevail in Farmington because of the far sightedness of the bankers in not over-extending credit.

On the other hand we hope that local financiers will not retrench to such a degree that outside capital will have to be sought for the development of Farmington. For we need and must have more homes for the accommodation of our growing population. Farmington will be to Detroit what Lake Forest is to Chicago and what the New Jersey suburbs are to New York. Therefore we have no room for pessimists in this community. For we are in financially sound condition and we are growing and our community has faith in her men and her future.

SAFETY DEVICE IS INVENTED

Signal Lamp on Rear of Automobile
Enables Driver to Signify
His Intentions.

The Scientific American illustrates and describes a signal lamp, invented by H. R. Andrews of Manila, P. I., as follows:

The object of the invention is to provide a device whereby an automobile driver may easily signify from the rear of his car to following automobiles or other vehicles his intention to slow down and stop, or of changing direction by turning either to the right



Front View and Section of the Device, or left, without diverting his attention from the proper management of his own car, thereby materially contributing to the safety of his car and those of others following in crowded traffic.

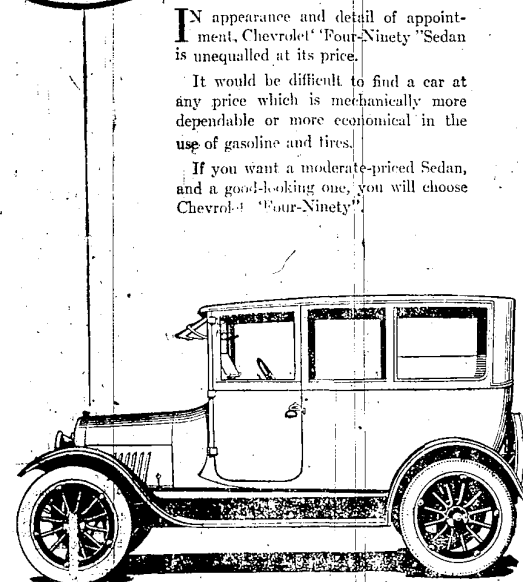
A five-gallon can of gasoline retails in the Argentine at anywhere from 6 pesos to 10 pesos (one peso equals \$0.4240).
