How Flies Feed.

A fly cannot directly eat solids, but must first excrete a drop of salivary liquid to dissolve the sugar or other substance it wishes to eat. This salivary liquid passes out through the spit tubes and is drawn back through them with the food in solution. At the base of the spit tube where it joins the mouthpiece, are several rows of horny teeth. These teeth, scratched up the particles of a solid like sugar, and the saliva exuded through the tongue dissolves them, and the sweetened liquid is drawn back.


It is ordered, That four months from this date be allowed for creditors to present claims against said estate.
