sign. So largely was he respect-
ed by his fellow townsmen that
he served them in several public
offices and as president of the
village and on the day of his
funeral the town flag floated at
halfmast in respect to his mem-
ory. He was also a prominent
member of the Masonic fraternity
and the order of the Eastern Star.
By his own request the funeral
service, were held at the house
and conducted by Rev. Evans of
the Presbyterian church and by
his brethren of the South Lynn
Lodge, F. & A. M. at the grave.

On February 23rd, 1898 he was
married to Addie Sigler of Pinck-
ney, who will continue to publish
the Herald. Besides his wife he
is survived by his father and
mother of Howell and two sisters,
Mrs. William Wilke of Flint, and
Mrs. John Hart of Howell. The
