ed by his fellow townsmen that
he served them in several public
offices and as president of the
village and on the day of his
funeral the town flag floated at
half-mast in respect to his mem-
ory. He was also a prominent
member of the Masonic fraternity
and the order of the Eastern Star.By his own request the funeral
service, were held at the home
and conducted by Rev. Evans of the
Presbyterian church and by his
brother of the South Lynn
Lodge, F. & A. M. at the grave.On February 23rd, 1898 he was
