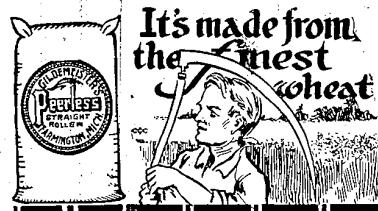

Notice of Review of Special Assessment for the Improvement of Assessment District Road No. 392, under Act 59, Public Acts of 1915, as amended.

To all persons interested in said assessment in the townships of Novi and Farmington, in Oakland County, Northville and Livonia, in Wayne County, to the said townships of Novi and Farmington, in Oakland County, Northville and Livonia, in Wayne County, and to the said Counties of Oakland and Wayne.

Whereas, I, as State Highway Commissioner of Michigan, have heretofore determined that the highway commencing at the north section corner common to sections 26 and 27, town 1 north, range 8 east, Novi Township, Oakland County; thence south on the section line between sections 26—27 and fractional sections 34—35 to the south section corner common to said fractional sections 34 and 35; thence east on the county line between fractional sections 35 and 36, town 1 north, range 8 east, Novi Township, Oakland County and fractional sections 2 and 1, town 1 south, range 8 east, Northville Township, Wayne County to the east section corner common to said fractional sections 36 and 1; thence continuing east on the county line between fractional sections 31, 32 and 33, town 1 north, range 9 east, Farmington Township, Oakland County and fractional sections 6, 5 and 4, town 1 south, range 9 east, Livonia Township, Wayne County to the south section corner common to fractional sections 33 and 34 of said Farmington township; thence north on the section line between fractional sections 33—34 and sections 27—28 to its intersection with the Grand River Road in the Village of Farmington, shall be improved in accordance with the specifications now on file; and

Whereas, I, as such commissioner did heretofore determine the boundaries of the special assessment district No. 392 for said highway known as Assessment District Road No. 392 to be as follows: Said district includes all lands within the following boundaries in the townships of Novi and Farmington, in Oakland County, Northville and Livonia, in Wayne County to-wit:

Commencing at the south ½ post common to sections 22 and 23, town 1 north, range 8 east, Novi Township, Oakland County; thence west ½ mile on the south east-and-west ½ line of said section 22 to its intersection with the west north-and-south ½ line of said section 22; thence south 2 ½ miles on the west north-and-south ½ line of sections 22, 27 and fractional section 34 to the west ½ post on the south side of said fractional section 34; thence west about ¼ mile on the south side of said fractional section 34 to the north corner common to fractional sections 3 and 4,

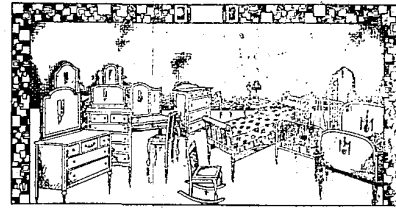
town 1 south, range 8 east, Northville Township, Wayne County; thence south ½ mile on the section line between fractional sections 3—4 to the ½ post common to said fractional sections 3 and 4; thence west ¼ mile on the east and west ¼ line of said fractional section 4 to its intersection with the east north-and-south ½ line of said fractional section 4; thence south ½ mile to the east north-and-south ½ line of said fractional section 4 to the east ½ post on the south side of said fractional section 4; thence east 1 ½ miles on the section line between fractional section 4 and section 9 and fractional section 3 and section 10 to the east section corner common to said fractional section 3 and section 10; thence north ½ mile on the section line between fractional sections 2—3 to the ½ post common to said fractional sections 2 and 3; thence east 2 miles on the east and west ¼ line of fractional sections 2 and 1 to the ¼ post on the west side of said fractional section 1; thence south on the east side of said fractional section 1 to the ¼ post on the west side of fractional section 6, town 1 south, range 9 east, Livonia Township, Wayne County; thence east 3 ½ miles on the east and west ¼ line of fractional sections 6, 5, 4 and 3 to the center of said fractional section 3; thence north ½ mile on the north and south ¼ line of said fractional section 3 to the ¼ post on the north side of said fractional section 3; thence east on the north side of said fractional section 3 to the ¼ post on the south side of fractional section 34, town 1 north, range 9 east, Farmington Township, Oakland County; thence north 2 miles on the north and south ¼ line of fractional section 34 and section 27 to the ¼ post on the north side of said section 27; thence west 1 mile on the north side of sections 27 and 28 to the ½ post on the north side of said section 28; thence south 1 ½ miles on the north and south ¼ line of section 28 and fractional section 33 to the center of said fractional section 33; thence west ½ mile on the east and west ¼ line of fractional sections 33, 32 and 31 to the center of said fractional section 31; thence north ½ mile on the north and south ¼ line of fractional section 31 and section 30 to its intersection with the south east-and-west ½ line of said section 30; thence west ½ mile on the south east-and-west ½ line of said section 30 to the south ½ post on the west side of said section 30; thence north on the west side of said section 30 to the south ½ post on the east side of section 25, town 1 north, range 8 east, Novi Township, Oakland County; thence west 1 ½ miles on the south east-and-west ½ line of sections 25 and 26 to its intersection with the north and south ¼ line of said section 26; thence north 1 mile on the north and south ¼ line of sections 26 and 23 to its intersection with the south east-and-west ½ line of said section 23; thence west ½ mile on the east-and-west ½ line of said section 23 to the place of beginning.

And all lands in the townships of Novi and Farmington, in Oakland County, Northville and Livonia, in Wayne County, within the boundaries above described, will enjoy the benefits for the improvement of said highway, and also the townships of Novi and Farmington, in Oakland County, Northville and Livonia, in Wayne County, within the boundaries above described, will enjoy the benefits of said highway.

Now, therefore, all owners of lands within the above described boundaries in the townships of Novi and Farmington, in Oakland County, Northville and Livonia, in Wayne County, and all persons interested in said lands and the townships of Novi and Farmington, in Oakland County and Northville and Livonia, in Wayne County, are hereby notified that on the 15th day of August, A. D. 1921 at 11:00 o'clock A. M., I will be present at the Village Hall in the Village of Northville, within the assessment district, and announce my assessment of benefits upon the lands within said boundaries constituting said special assessment district, and upon the townships of Novi and Farmington, in Oakland County, Northville and Livonia, in Wayne County, and upon the Counties of Oakland and Wayne, at large, and the said assessment of benefits will be open to review. All persons, said townships or counties may appear and be heard with respect to their several opportunities of benefits for said highway.
