

NEW SAFETY GATE FOR RAILROAD CROSSINGS DECLARED FOOL PROOF



Officials of the Chicago elevated railway lines have tested a new safety gate for railroad crossings which is said to be "fool-proof" against the careless automobile driver who now and then drives through the old-fashioned wooden gate and wakes up with a bump. The new gate will not allow an automobile to pass. If a car runs into it the gate gives several feet and then bounces the car back like a rubber ball.

NO TROUBLE TO KEEP CAR QUIET

Oil Can and Wrench Will Banish the Squeaks.

Necessary to See That All Parts Are Greased Regularly and That All Nuts Are Properly Tightened.

There is no excuse for a noisy automobile. Only carelessness and lack of attention can account for squeaks in any car. The automobile that squeaks you, carrying its own load is a reflection on the owner and he may be set down as thoughtless. "Sometimes it is hard to find a squeak, but that does not mean that it is hard to find the big ones," says a prominent dealer. "The one and only enemy of the squeak is the oil can and the single enemy of the rattle is the wrench. Keep the car tightened up and the parts greased sufficiently and your car will run as silently and smoothly after a year's use as the day you bought it."

"It is not necessary to be everlastingly at it. But it is necessary to see that all parts are greased regularly. If you have a driver see that he takes care of the car properly, that he goes over it carefully all the time and greases and oils it when he should. If you drive and care for your own car, you must grease it and oil it regularly. Take the oiling chart and make it a rule to do your work at stated intervals."

"Keep the car lubricated. It will repay you in added car life, minimum mechanical trouble and greater satisfaction all round."

NEWLY INVENTED MUD GUARD

Acts as Shield to Prevent Throwing of Mud Against Radiator by the Wheels.

The object of this new invention is to prevent the throwing of mud against the radiator by the wheels. A further




Diagram Showing Guard in Use.

Charles J. Swain claims to have owned the first automobile in Philadelphia, in 1886, and since that time he has owned 24 different cars.


The Royal Danish Automobile Club, in Copenhagen, was founded in 1901. Prince Axel is president of the club, which has a membership of 1,000.

FLASHLIGHT COMES IN HANDY

The idea would be of little use to the driver who




A Flashlight Clamp Is Handy for Lone Night Driver.

The metal used should be either brass or steel, but the spring which holds the flashlight must of course have sufficient springiness for this purpose. The light will be found convenient for tire changing in the position shown, but if some other angle is preferred, the clamp can readily be made to give it.—Popular Mechanics.

AUTO WITH WIRELESS TELEPHONE

Physicians, business men, or in fact anyone who owns an enclosed automobile can now equip their automobiles with a wireless telephone at a cost of about \$50, or just about the price of a new tire or battery.

With autos thus equipped physicians could be in constant communication with their homes for emergency calls, and the business man in touch with his office.

The instrument installed in the automobile, shown in the photograph, will work successfully up to five miles and use only a small part of the auto battery current.

The two young men, shown in the photograph, in experimenting, found that it was not necessary to have antennae high up in the air, but found that the wires stretched around the top of the car were successful. Four parallel copper wires run around the top of the auto on 6-inch posts fastened to the corners. They then grounded the set to the auto's engine as is done in airplanes. In their experiments they were constantly in touch with their home provided they were in the five-mile limit.

Short Night in Scotch Highlands.

In the early July days the Highlands may truly be called a land where there is no night, writes a correspondent of the London Daily Mail from Elgin, Scotland, for sunset and sunrise are really one and the same. Officially the sun appears for about six hours, but the track of its passage from northwest to northeast is marked by a crimson glow above the horizon which serves to link the long summer days together in an unbroken chain.
