

Oakland Community College's Orchard Ridge Campus began its third year, in September, 1969, with an enrollment of 5,370 students, an increase of 22.7% over 1968's 4,149

Orchard Ridge is the largest of OCC's facilities both in enrollment and physical plant, contributing 40° of the total college student popularities of south of 1-850 between Orchard Lake and Farmington roads. The 19-acre parcel was purchased late in 1964 and ground was broken on Dec. 13, 1965, by Gov. George Romney, U.S. Rep. Billie S. Farmum. and Clitford H. Smart.
