Mr. Charles Sidney Lee, formerly M. E. pastor here, spent the day recently with Dr. and Mrs. J. D. Miller.

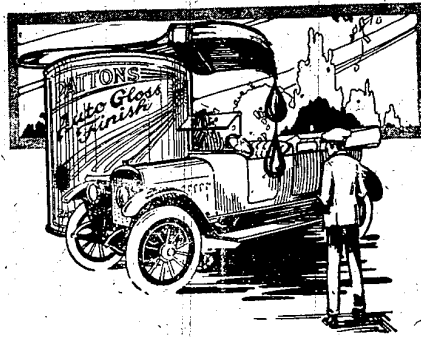
Jesse Gates is able to ride out a little now. He has been very slow in recovering from his recent operation.
