How is this matter to be guarded against in the future-for it hay happen again at any time?

There is but one way, and that is to provide a storage tank sufficient capacity to supply the village with water whether the g imps are in working order or not.

This matter will be submitted to the people of Farmington the annual Village Election. What shall we do at that time?

Shall we wait until we have a disastrous fire or until next summer when it becomes dry and hot and then find ourselves out of water the same as we did last summer and the summer before, or shall we provide the storage tank and thus insure a water sup-I ly sufficient to meet all needs?

Just think this matter over, Mr. Taxpayer, when you go to ne polls Monday, March 13, 1922.
