WHAT WOULD HAVE HAPPENED?

Suppose a fire had broken out in Farmington Monday night, between the hours of 5 P. M. and 5 A. M., what would have been the result? The Pump which supplies the village water broke down Monday night and it required twelve hours to repair the damage.

During these 12 hours Farmington was without Fire Protection, and the householders were without water for domestic use.

How is this matter to be guarded against in the future—for it may happen again at any time?

There is but one way, and that is to provide a storage tank of sufficient capacity to supply the village with water whether the pumps are in working order or not.

This matter will be submitted to the people of Farmington at the annual Village Election. What shall we do at that time?

Shall we wait until we have a disastrous fire or until next summer when it becomes dry and hot and then find ourselves out of water the same as we did last summer and the summer before, or shall we provide the storage tank and thus insure a water supply sufficient to meet all needs?

Just think this matter over, Mr. Taxpayer, when you go to the polls Monday, March 13, 1922.
