SUPPORT YOUR COUNCIL.

The people of Farmington have chosen seven representative men to represent them on the village council—a president and six trustees. These men are all interested in Farmington, in its growth and advancement, just the same as you are. They are your representatives selected to conduct your village affairs, and as your representatives they ought to receive your cooperation and support when they strive to do something that will advance the interests of the village.

These men will ask you to vote for them in the sum of \$8,000 for the purpose of erecting a storage tank for the water works when you go to the polls Monday. They have given this matter careful consideration and after having considered the proposition carefully they recommend that these bonds be issued. We do not believe there is any man—your representatives—would have reached this decision if they had any idea that this action was not for the best interests of the whole village.

The village needs and must have an adequate water supply—a supply that will meet all its needs under any and all circumstances. These needs cannot be met from our present water system without a storage tank—that is the opinion of your representatives.

As a voter and a resident of Farmington are you going to vote to support your council or are you going to oppose them in this vital matter and then when something goes wrong with the storage system next summer stand back and find fault? With the new storage tank the water supply will always be ample to care for any ordinary condition and it will insure an abundance of water at all

times.

A vote for the bonds next Monday will be a vote of approval of the manner in which members of your council are conducting the affairs of the village.

Resolution of Village Council for the Village of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan.

STEEL WATER RESERVOIR AND WATER WORKS EXTENSION THERETO.

Whereas, an estimate of the cost for the material, a paratus, and accessories for the construction of a steel water reservoir and a water main extension thereto has been presented and submitted to the Village Council for the Village of Farmington;

Therefore, Be it resolved that the said estimate and statement as submitted be accepted, approved, adopted and placed on file.

Resolved further, that this Village Council deems the construction of said water reservoir and said extension and other matters set forth in said estimate thereby, a necessary public improvement for the use and benefit of the public and that the erection of said steel water reservoir is necessary in order to reserve and stabilize the water supply of the village of Farmington.

Resolved further, that it is necessary to raise the sum of 8,000 dollars shown in said estimate for the construction of said steel water reservoir and extension of water mains thereto and that it is also necessary to issue the bonds of

the village of Farmington therefor to run for a period of eight years, with interest not to exceed 6 per cent per annum payable semi-annually.

Resolved further, that the question of raising said sum of 8,000 dollars and the issuing of the bonds of the village of Farmington therefor be submitted to the qualified electors of the village of Farmington at a special election to be held for that purpose on the 13th day of March, A. D. 1922.

Resolved further, that the said special election called for the 13th day of March, A. D. 1922 for the purpose of voting on the question of issuing bonds for steel water reservoir and making proper connections thereto be held at the town hall in said village of Farmington, and that the polls of said election shall be open from 9 o'clock in the forenoon until 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon (Central Standard Time) of said day.

Resolved further, that the village clerk shall give public notice of said special election and he is hereby directed to authorize so to do in the following form:

Application will also be made for authority to modify the present schedule of Toll Rates with reference to the "Person-to-Person," "Appointment Call" and "Messenger Call" classifications of toll service only.
