Through its efforts, arid and largedy uninhabitable and unproductive land has become green with lush crops. SUPPORTED largely by coins dropped into the blue and owhite J.N.F. moneybores in Jewish homes and institutions around the world, the agency began purchasing land in Pal-estine at the turn of the cen-tury. Today, J.N.F. is the sole agency responsible for all land development in Israel. No cultivated land was ever sold to J.N.F. and only 25% of all land acquired was cultiva-ble at the time of purchase. The rest had to be laboriously cleared before it could be farmed. By 1947, 87% of all devide nettlements were on J.N.F. land. As hundred of housands of timingrantire 1948, J.N.F. stepped ap its land reclama-tion. Between 1948-67, 521 new settlements were created on
