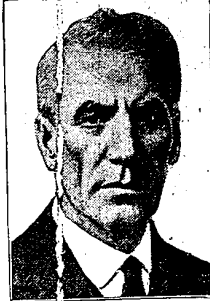

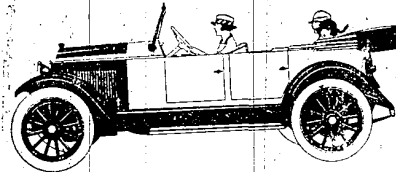
Mr. Jones is a staff lecturer of the International Lions Clubs.

You Auto Know

That in the case of a skid—particularly one caused by the slipping of the rear wheels, rather than the front ones—the worst possible thing to do is to apply the brakes. The amateur driver's first impulse when anything unforeseen happens is to press down hard with both feet, disengaging the clutch and at the same time applying the full force of the foot-brake. This dual action upon the rear wheel only accentuates the skid and causes him to have far less control of his car than if he had kept his feet off either pedal.

The best course to take is to allow the car to coast, at the same time attempting to steer in the same direction in which the rear end of the car is skidding. Then, if it is imperative that the car be stopped to avoid a collision, press the foot-brake slowly and the car will stop almost without a skid. The best possible preventive of skidding, however, is care in driving and a refusal to take chances on turning a corner, especially when
