

taxes in Oakland county, and this has been used by one of the arguments against widening Woodward Avenue at the county's expense. Let me say right here that if we can get state aid for this work from the next legislature, which meets in January, I am for doing it that way, but if this means a long delay it is up to the county to do the job in its own way.  
Cost is No Obstacle.

"The cost of the job is no obstacle at all. That county would never feel it, for the improvement would pay for itself in a few years in advanced property values and increased business. It has been estimated that the whole street could be built for less than a million dollars. It financed by a bond issue, the tax, based on present valuation of the property in the county, would be less than three mills the first year and this would constantly diminish as the bonds were retired and the property values increased.

"One of the arguments frequently heard against a wider Woodward Avenue is that it would benefit chiefly the people living in the southern end of the county, near Detroit. That seems to me rather silly. When you stop to think that we have to traverse only a mile or so of the dangerous part while people living in Birmingham, Pontiac and beyond have to put up with it for from nine to 15 miles. Conditions are bad enough now, I hate to think how much worse they are going to be when the city opens up that new two-mile stretch from the Six to the Eight-mile road.

"I believe Oakland county owes it to itself to widen Woodward Avenue from the Eight-mile road to Pontiac in 1923, and it is going through with a bang or the people will know the reason why."

It has come to Mr. Ostrander's ears that some of the present employees of the road commission have been told they would lose their jobs if he is elected.


"No employee who is giving the county an honest day's work need have any fears on my account," he declared. "I have promised no jobs and am not under obligation to anyone. I am out to serve the whole county as conscientiously as I know how if the people see fit to nominate and elect me road commissioner."

#### Possibility of Saving Coal.

An ordinary passenger locomotive consumes a pound of fuel for every 82 feet it travels. Each unnecessary stop, made with a heavy freight or passenger train, represents a fuel loss of from 500 to 750 pounds of coal, depending on the weight of the train, the length of the stop and the grade conditions. A brakeman's air-leak on a train of 50 freight cars has been known to cause a loss of as much as 2,540 pounds of coal in an ten-hour period. The loss of coal each time a modern locomotive now stops for five minutes is about 75 pounds. If locomotive firemen were to save a little more than one shovelful of coal out of each ten used, the total saving would be equal to nearly one per cent of all the coal handled.—Floyd W. Parsons, in World's Work.

#### Pestilential Broom-Rap.

An arch-enemy of clover is the broom-rap, of which there are no fewer than one hundred and eighty varieties. Their method of robbery is to penetrate the ground with their roots just as far as the roots of their favorite host. Then they fasten themselves, and feast on the sap which the victim unwillingly makes for them. Their seed never dies. It may be dormant in the ground for years; but if it finds itself at just the right depth below the surface, it will waste no time in germinating.


