Famed Pastor Visits Calvary

Reinhold A. Barth, pastor, youth speaker and evangelist, will speak in meetings in Calvary Baptist Church, 43065 Joy, Plymouth, Jan. 11 to 18. He will address Sunday services at 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. and week night meetings at 7:15 p.m.

Reinhold Barth began to study theology and preached when only 15 years of age. He was ordained to the gospel ministry before his 21st birthday, and has pastored churches in Michigan and Illinois for 12 years. He was founder and for several years director of Kalamazoo Youth for Christ, a Saturday night youth rally that continues now in its 23rd year.

In the summer and fall of 1948 Barth spent 13 weeks in Europe, first as a delegate at the World Congress on Evangelism at Beatenberg, Switzerland, and then preaching in the countries surrounding Switzerland, and in Great Britain. Affiliated with Youth for Christ International for nine years,

Inter Faith Project: Draft Counseling Center Opens

"We consult experts about the best means to fill out our income tax forms," Copenhaver explained, "and this is the same type of service we hope to perform at the center."

"As an individual," the pastor continued, "I think that every person has to make up his own mind about service in the armed forces just as he does about many other things in life."

The formal explanation of the center cautions that "The principles to be followed in the operation of the center will be that of legal draft counseling—explaining the provisions of the selective service system and possible penalties for non-compliance. No suggestion, pressure or persuasion will be used to influence the conscience of any individual."

INFORMATION will be provided on these basic points during the counseling sessions.

- These are:
- How the "lottery" system works.
 - Draft registration.
 - Draft classification.
 - Deferments, both occupational and student.
 - Exemptions (ministerial, etc.).
 - Alternative service which includes non-combatant service.

- Draft board hearings and legal advice.
- Referral for medical and legal advice.
- Changes in the selective service regulations.

Church School Helps Nursing Home Patients

The lives of eight cerebral palsy patients in Farmington's Oak Hill nursing home are a bit more enjoyable because of the Christmas project of Sunday school children in the First United Methodist Church of Farmington.

The youngsters used their special Yale collection to provide a wall clock, 20 books, an assortment of records and a movie screen, for the adult patients in a pilot project at the home.

In addition, each of the patients received a comb and brush set.

The patients there are adult victims of cerebral palsy involved in a project known as Living Opportunities.

THE PILOT PROGRAM—only one in the country—is an attempt to see what can be done to give opportunity for a selected group of handicapped people to live away from home and learn to manage their lives.

The program is funded for three years with Medicaid furnishing basic fees for nursing care, room and board. Among the funding agencies are the Farmington Jaycees.

The Sunday school children brought their contributions on the four Sundays during December, and each class and teacher decided on the gift that would be given. All the gifts were brought to the Dec. 21 morning services for special dedication.

Mrs. William T. Smith, church school superintendent, directed the project.

Witnesses 'Who's In Control' Topic Of Lecture

The semi-annual Bible Convention of the Jehovah Witnesses is meeting this weekend in the congregation's new Assembly Hall, 10809 Grand River, Detroit.

Angelo A. Cantanzaro, special representative of the Watchtower Bible and Tract Society and district manager for the Jehovah's Witnesses, is conducting the meeting.

More than 1,000 delegates representing eight congregations from Southeastern Michigan are in attendance.

General theme of the week-end convention is "Right Kind of Ministers."

The delegates will attend a modern ministry school which is the world-wide school of advanced training for the ministers of the Jehovah's Witnesses.

Saturday's highlight is a baptism ceremony for new ministers. Cantanzaro will deliver the keynote address entitled "True Worship Versus the False" on Sunday.

"Who's In Control" is the title of a Christian Science lecture to be given here Thursday, Jan. 15 by Charles W. Ferris, C.S.B., of Minneapolis. The lecture is open to the community free of charge. It will begin at 8 p.m. in Fourth Church of Christ, Scientist, 2400 West Seven Mile, and will last about an hour.

Ferris entered the healing ministry of Christian Science after graduation from the University of Chicago and a period of service in the United States Army. He was a chaplain's assistant during his Army career and also served as a field worker for Christian Science Activities for the Armed Services. In 1961 he became a teacher of Christian Science.

Ferris is currently on tour throughout the United States and Canada as a member of the Board of Lectureship of The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass.
