## Schools Add Two Courses To Program

TWO NEW courses have been approved by Farmington Board of Education for the school year 1970-71. Music theory I is designed for the serious music student. It includes the development of fundamental skills in ear training, dictation, sight-singing, theory, harmony, and analysis. The course is intended to bring the student's knowledge of basic musicianship to the level necessary for entrance to a major school of music.

A one-semester blue print reading course has been added for vocational machine shop students who are recommended by their shop instructor. Here the student will learn how to read prints essential to the set-up and performance of machine shop operations. Included will be a study of orthographic projection, sectioning, auxiliaries, symbols, positioning, and dimensioning.

## Bond Issue Is Approved

FARMINGTON A total of \$125,000 in bonds has been approved by the Michigan Municipal Finance Commission to finance road improvement work in the City of Farmington.

The proceeds from the bond sale will finance work on Alta Loma Drive and in the city's Woodcroft Subdivision. According to Farmington City Manager John Dinan, the work on both projects has already been completed.

Dinan said that bids on the new bonds will be received during the Jan. 19 city council meeting.

Approved were \$50,000 in general obligation bonds and \$75,000 for a special assessment district.

The general obligation bonds are payable from the general tax levy, while the special assessment bonds are due in nine annual installments.

**\$75,000 SPECIAL ASSESSMENT STREET IMPROVEMENT BONDS** (Districts Nos. 69-44 and 69-45)

Said bonds for the purchase of the above bonds will be received to the undersigned at the City Hall, 25600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan, on or before the following dates: January 1970, at which time and place said bids will be publicly opened and read.

Said General Obligation Bonds will consist of ten (10) coupon bonds of the denomination of \$5,000 each, numbered consecutively in direct order of maturity from 1 to 10 (ten inclusive), will be dated January 1, 1970 and will mature serially without option of prior redemption as follows:

- \$ 5,000 September 1st of each year from 1970 to 1977, inclusive
- \$10,000 September 1, 1978

Said Special Assessment Bonds will be coupon bonds and consist of fifteen (15) bonds of the denomination of \$5,000 each, numbered consecutively in direct order of maturity from 1 to 15 (fifteen inclusive), will be dated January 1, 1970 and will mature serially without option of prior redemption as follows:

- \$ 5,000 September 1, 1970
- \$ 5,000 September 1, 1971
- \$ 5,000 September 1, 1972
- \$10,000 September 1st of each of the years 1973 and 1974

Said Special Assessment Bonds will bear interest from their date at a rate or rates not exceeding five and five-tenths (5 1/2) per cent (5 1/2%) per annum, expressed in multiples of 1/8 of 1% (1 1/8%) or any combination thereof. General Obligation Bonds will bear interest from their date at a rate or rates not exceeding six per cent (6%) per annum, expressed in multiples of 1/8 of 1% (1 1/8%), as an evaluation interest. Said interest will be payable on September 1, 1970 and semi-annually thereafter on March 1st and September 1st of each year. The interest rate on any one bond shall be at one rate only and shall be expressed by only one coupon for the same coupon period and all bonds maturing in the same year shall carry the same interest rate. None of said bonds shall bear interest at a rate upon the whole which is less than 5% of the rate borne by any other bonds of this issue.

Both principal and interest will be payable at a bank or trust company qualified to act as paying agent under the Statutes of the State of Michigan or of the United States of America, to be designated by the original purchaser of the bonds. The designation of the paying agent shall be subject to the approval of the City. Accrued interest to the date of delivery of said bonds must be paid by the purchaser at the time of delivery.

For the purpose of assessing the bonds, the interest cost of each bid will be computed by determining, at the rate or rates specified therein, the total dollar value of all interest on the bonds from February 1, 1970, to their maturity, and deducting therefrom any premium, or adding thereon any discount. The bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose bid on the above-mentioned procedure shows the lowest interest cost. No proposal for the purchase of less than all of the bonds herein offered, or at a price less than their par value will be considered, provided however, that interest will be payable on September 1, 1970 and semi-annually thereafter on March 1st and September 1st of each year. If of their par value will be considered.

The Special Assessment Bonds are issued in anticipation of the collection in full of the amount of the new special assessment levied on the property owners in Special Assessment Rolls Nos. 69-44 and 69-45, inclusive for the purpose of paying part of the cost of street improvements in said Special Assessment Districts. All of the City of Farmington, and in addition to the special assessments will pledge the full faith and credit of the City for their payment. The Bonds of obligation on the special assessment districts in the manner provided in the bond authorizing resolution.

The General Obligation Bonds are authorized for the purpose of paying part of the City portion cost of the hereinbefore described improvements in Special Assessment Districts Nos. 69-44 and 69-45, and the full faith and credit of the City are pledged for their payment. The City will be required to levy taxes without limitation to the rate or amount for their payment.

A certified or cashier's check of the amount of \$2,500 drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company, payable to the order of the City of Farmington, and accompanying each bid as a guarantee of good faith on the part of the bidder, to be forfeited as liquidated damages if said bid is accepted and the bidder fails to take up and pay for the bonds. No interest will be allowed on the good faith checks, and checks of unsuccessful bidders will be immediately returned to each bidder, representative or its registered mail. Bids shall be conditioned upon the unqualified opinion of Miller, Canfield, Dineen & Smith, attorneys of Detroit, Michigan, approving the legality of the bonds, which opinion will be furnished without expense to the purchaser of the bonds prior to the delivery thereof. The City will also be furnished the usual closing certificates, dated as of the date of delivery of and payment for the bonds, including a statement that there is no litigation pending or, to the knowledge of the signers thereof, threatened, affecting the validity of the bonds. The City shall furnish bonds ready for execution at its expense. Bonds will be delivered at such place as may be agreed upon with the purchaser. The right is reserved to reject any or all bids. Bidders contemplating the bids should be marked clearly "Proposed Bonds".

In the event that prior to delivery of the bonds the interest received by private holders from bonds of the same type and character shall be taxable by the terms of any Federal income tax law, ruling, regulation or court decision, the holder of any such bond may, at his election, be relieved of the obligations under the contract to purchase the bonds, and in such case the deposit accompanying his bid will be returned.
