A novel entertainment feature was introduced at the morning

The pictures of the young ladies receiving the highest number of votes will be thrown on the screen next Tuesday, and the names of the ten following in order will also be seen on the screen. The voting will be continued next Tuesday on the twelve standing highest on the voting list.

Until Tuesday next the finalists will remain a secret. The final voting will take place on Tuesday, November 21st. The winner will receive a reward. Any girl between the ages of 12 and 20 and residing in Farmington Village or township will be eligible for nomination.

Following this contest others will be introduced which will include girls between the ages of five and twelve, boys of all ages, babies and the contests will continue for some time.

The purpose of the contest is to provide interesting entertainment, also to supply an incentive to the young people to cultivate the qualities of neatness and simplicity in dress and to give careful and thoughtful attention to their appearance to off-set any tendency to slovenliness on the one hand and an excess of adornment on the other. All of which will lead to the stressing of the higher appearance that real beauty is a spiritual quality, and all outward forms and appearance are the reflections of inward desires and motives.

THE HORN OF THE

HUNTER IS HEARD

for deer, on Friday, November 10 thirteen men from Farmington and vicinity will join the Upper Peninsula ready for the appearance of

the first buck! The hunters left Farmington Tuesday evening for Northville where they help to make up a party of 31 who have Pullman accommodations for the entire distance. The party started over the Pere Marquette by way of Bay City, and go by the way of the Saginaw and Marquette, and expect to reach their several destinations Thursday. The local boys go to Covington, to their hunting grounds located on a tract of 40 acres which some of the men purchased a couple of years ago. The members of the party are, John Phelps, Will Way, Clarence Bickling, Lou Schroeder, Harrison Johnson, Olin Russel, Harold Oldenburg, Ralph Hogle, Fred Schaupeter, John Turner and Horace Durham.

There is a substantial log house on the farm and the men expect to do their own cooking and housekeeping. The law this year permits of shooting only bucks and they must have horns at least three inches long. Each hunter is allowed to kill and ship one buck and one buck is allowed for use in camp. It is six miles to the nearest town, but with the substantial grocery stock that was sent on ahead we expect the boys to fare well and when they return, about November 29, they will be well toughened up and with a buck or two.

Tom Gibson and Frank Chafy go with the Northville men to Kenton, about 12 miles beyond Covington. They will make their headquarters in a tent.

The Home Guards will meet on Monday, November 13th, at four o'clock p. m.
