sculpture. As Smith says in the film, "Children's toys are mainly about pretending to be grownup — the things I make are about what it's like when you get there."

• "How the Myth was Made," 59 minutes, color: A retrospective view of the making of Robert Flaherty's classic, "Man of Aran," shot in Ireland's Aran Islands in 1933 and 1934. Includes interviews with participants in the original opus.

THE FOLLOWING will be shown from 11 a.m. to noon, March 25 in the Farmington branch library on Liberty and State.

• "An Easter Carol," 28 minutes, color: Depicts mission/ministry in the Synod of the Northeast of the United Presbyterian Church, U.S.A. The intent is to stimulate awareness and understanding of mission and ministry.

• "Sami Herders," 28 minutes, color: A year-long record of a reindeer herding Lapp family living the ancient nomadic lifestyle in 20th century Europe, showing environmental adaptation in a sub-arctic setting.

The following will be shown from 4 to 5:30 p.m., March 25 in the Farmington Hills library on Twelve Mile.

• "La Soufriere," 30 minutes, color: In 1976, scientists predicted a volcanic eruption that would destroy Guadeloupe. The island was evacuated. The newspapers reported that one man refused to leave. Director Werner Herzog immediately arrived with a small crew in order to be on hand for the end. What resulted is an eerie, unique view of city abandoned, on the verge of annihilation and a catastrophe that didn't occur.

• "BETWEEN Men," 57 minutes, color: A study of masculinity and the military. Interviews with veterans from World War I to Vietnam and men who have recently joined as well as those who have made the military their career. Not a film about economics and armaments but about men who become warriors and the consequences to our lives.

The following films will be shown from 10 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., March 26 in the Farmington branch library on Lib-

erty and State.

• "Pipeline" 28 minutes, color: Story of the construction of the Alaska Pipeline project. Focuses on the difficult job of building the line safely and on time in the harsh environment of the Alaskan wilderness.

• "The Power of Listening," 26 minutes, color: Shows the importance of good listening habits in business and school and how to develop them. Examples show how most people consider themselves better listeners than they are. Features a lively "listening" workshop with a group of professional men and women exploring the full meaning of "active listening."

• "Sunchanger," 10 minutes, color: To improve understanding of the importance of the beef animal as a producer of protein and emphasizing that most of its feed isn't useful to humans. Shows some aspects of beef production in various parts of the country emphasizing the production of protein on marginal land.

• "THE Office," 30 seconds, color: An anti-smoking message.

The following can be seen from 7 to 8:30 p.m., March 26 in the Farmington Hills branch, Twelve Mile.

• "The Spongers" 91 minutes, color: Left by her husband with four children (one a 14-year-old Monogoloid) to feed and clothe, Pauline Crosby goes from one social service agency to the next in the frustrating attempt to keep her head above water. As they "sponge" off various agencies, the family's desperate plight is ironically set against the pageantry of the Royal Family's Silver Jubilee celebration. Nothing works for this quietly desperate woman.

The following will be shown from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., March 27 in the Farmington branch library on Liberty and State.

• "No Maps on My Taps," 59 minutes, color: A performance documentary on black jazz tap dancing. Through the lives of three renowned dancers today, the film shows tap dancing as an art form created and developed by black Americans and deeply rooted within their culture. We learn about the history of tap but most importantly we feel the spirit and love of the artists
