It served stage coach passengers and by 1860 when Milton C. Botsford acquired it, the tavern was a meeting place for drovers, farmers and travelers. Henry Ford courted his wife Clara at the inn. He purchased the inn in 1924, restored it and his family operated it until 1951.
