

OU women cagers head for tournament

The Oakland University women's basketball team will be making its first appearance at the Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) regional basketball tournament today.

The Pioneers will travel to Indiana State University in Terra Haute, Ind. to challenge top-seeded Northwestern at 4 p.m.

The Pioneers, 17-10 for the season, placed second in the state tournament at Michigan State University last week. Oakland upset number-three seed Western Michigan University (81-59) and number-two seed Michigan State University (75-69).

Oakland lost in the finals to top-seeded University of Detroit Titans — ranked 20th in the country. The second-place finish by the Pioneers was the best finish in the state tournament in OU's women's basketball history.

The chant by the OU cagers was 3-2-1, and the impossible dream almost came through.

The first mission — "3" — was West-ern Michigan.

Led by senior All-American Helen Sherada's 33 points and 19 rebounds, the Pioneers outscored the Broncos 50-28 in the second half to coast to an unexpected victory. The Pioneers shot a red-hot 55.3 percent in the second half after shooting only 29.5 percent from the field in the opening half and going into the lockerrooms tied at 31.

Sherada received excellent support from freshman forward Lisa Crawford, who scored 14 points, and freshman center Teresa Vondrasek, who netted 13 points and grabbed 11 rebounds. Freshman guard Anne Kish was also in double figures with 12.

THE SECOND target — "2" — was MSU.

Vondrasek dominated the inside game and Kish the outside game as the Lady Pioneers took at 37-32 halftime advantage. Vondrasek scored 13 points, and grabbed six rebounds in the first

half before finishing the game with 15 points and 11 rebounds.

Kish and Sherada each led the scoring with 19 points, while freshman guard Kelly Kenny had 12.

MSU outscored the Pioneers 32-23 in the field goal department, but the OU cagers cashed in on 29-34 from the foul line for an 85.3 percent average. The host Spartans managed only two of six foul shots.

Mission "1" was just too much for the state's "Cinderella" team.

The Lady Pioneers played the Lady Titans even for the first 17 minutes of the first half. Trailing 30-28 with three minutes remaining, the Pioneers were held scoreless through the rest of the opening period at the Titans took a 38-28 advantage.

OU did not score in the opening 3:09 of the second half, and did not convert its first field goal until 14:42 when Crawford hit a lay-up. By then the Pioneers trailed 53-34.

Krawford led the Pioneers with 20

points and 11 rebounds, while Sherada managed 16 points and 12 rebounds. Vondrasek contributed 10 points, while OU guards Kenny and Kish added 14 and 12 points, respectively.

U-D sophomore Lisa Blackburn led the Titans with a school-record 30 points, while all-state performer Cheryl Williams and Lydia Johnson added 19 and 16 points.

Sherada was honored before the championship game as OU's lone representative on the all-state team. Also named to the squad were Eastern Michigan's Laurie Byrd; Michigan's Diane Dietz; Michigan State's Mary Kay Intyre; Wayne State's Monica Thomas; Central Michigan's Julie Roberts; Western's Patti Rendine; and U-D's Williams, Johnson and Mary Lillie.

MEN'S SWIMMING

Oakland University, Wayne State and Ferris State College competed in the annual Oakland Invitational last weekend, and, although there were no

team scores kept, OU coach Ernie Maglischo's team fared quite well.

Mike O'Hagen qualified for the nationals in the 500-yard freestyle with a 4:43.42, as did Mark Vagle (4:46.12) and Eivind Hansen (4:46.12). Vagle, a Uica Eisenhower graduate, qualified in the 400-yard IM with a 4:16.77.

Junior Mark Doyle continued his fine showing in the backstroke events, qualifying in the 100-yard backstroke with a time of 0:54.80. Hansen also qualified in the 1,650-yard freestyle with a 16:30.64.

Breaststrokers Tom Allen and Shawn Wery both qualified for the nationals in the 100-yard event with respective times of 1:00.67 and 1:00.81.

The OU swimmers will compete in the NCAA Division II nationals in Youngstown, Ohio March 20-22.

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Sophomore forward Bill Peterson was named the Most Valuable Player on the 1979-80 OU squad by a vote of his teammates.

Peterson played in all 27 contests for the Pioneers, which finished the season with a 13-14 mark. The 6-6 sophomore averaged 10.5 points and 6.1 rebounds. He started 24 games, hit 52.8 percent from the field and 74.5 percent from the free-throw line.

Rich Brauer was named to the all-GLIAC basketball team.

Brauer was the team's leading scorer (16.6) and rebounder (8.6). The 6-5 junior forward shot 54.5 percent from the floor, and 75.6 percent from the foul line. He had 30-point efforts against Central Michigan University and Northwood Institute.

MEN'S WRESTLING

Senior tri-captain Tim Chapel won the 177-pound weight class to lead the OU wrestling team to a second-place tie at the GLIAC wrestling tournament.

Chapel finished the year with a 15-6 record. The GLIAC championship also mark the end of the wrestling careers for seniors Phil Liebhang and Mike Eble.

The high scoring expected when the all-stars competed in the women's city tournament over the past weekend failed to materialize, though leadership was taken over by the women in several events.

Penny Behn, captain of the Bonanza team, moved to the top in the actual all-events with 1,818. She rolled 595 in the team event, followed with 608 in the doubles and added 615 in the singles.

Meanwhile, Kimberly Conner, a substitute for Cheryl Daniels of the Livonia Bowling Supply team, took the lead in the handicap singles with a 694 that included a 94-pin spot.

The best team score was a 2,749 rolled by Cora Friebig's Luxury Lanes team.

ASIDE FROM the women's tournament at Drake'shire Lane, the pins were flying in the other precincts of the western suburbs.

When the firing ceased, the 700 club

had seven new members and five of the were posted at Westland Lanes.

Mike Lee paced the group with a 776 in the Little Caesar Classic and was followed by Dick Beattie with 768, Bob Jawor with 726 and Bob Schmidt with 710.

The fifth came in the Monday men's league when Phil Kupras found the range for a 710.

Joining them in the club were Bob Szigmanski, who rolled a 718 in the St. Linus League, at Garden Lanes, and Don Nero who posted a 714 in the Legion League at Merri-Bowl.

ONE OF THE best performances of the week was the showing of Fred Young, an 11-year-old member of the youth league at Merri-Bowl. In his regular YBA competition, he laced games of 230, 289 and 237 for 676. It was the highest score ever bowled in the league.

Among the adult competitors, Mary Schmede showed the way to the field in

the invitational doubles classic with 607. At this figure she beat Virginia Link by seven pins, while Jan Wright landed third with 594.

In the men's senior house league, Randy Smith converted the 7-10 split and, like most others who turned the trick, he doesn't know how he did it. In the Legion League, Jerry Falat posted a 669, good only for second place in the face of Nero's 700.

THERE WAS another close race at Garden Lanes when Irv Conter led the parade in the Wayne County League with a 605 that gave him a mere 11-pin margin over Ron Hall. In the Vinco league Ed Margonisk was high with 600.

LOREN RIGOLO had an odd experience in the Church of the Holy Spirit club at Woodland Lanes. He started with games of 289 and 212 and yet had to settle for a 654. Meanwhile in the Kings and Queens loop, Sue Scheuler, who carries a 156 average, rolled a 243

game. It was her best showing to date.

In the Saturday juniors, Shelley Staczel, with a 159 average, went 155 pins over her average with a 605. And in the Parks and Recreation loop, John Sewrnik, 14 years old, rolled a 248 game.

In the senior house league, Jerry Cole Jr. narrowly missed a membership in the 700 club and had to be content with a 698.

CHARLES RIFFLE was another who experienced the converting of the 7-10 split. He did it by hitting the 10 hard enough to have it bounce off the backboard and topple the No. 7 at Westland Bowl.
