## Sewing techniques using ultra suede shown in workshop

Minnie Vantrease, a noted sewing and tailoring authority, brings her sewing talents to Farmington Community Center at 9:30 a.m. Wednesday, March 12, for a session called "Ultra-Suede Workshop."

"My workshop should allay any preconceived fears about working with ultra-suede," she says. "My students lose any apprehensions quickly about tackling this luxury fabric and then go on to achieve very professional results."

Mrs. Vantrease says she has new ideas to share with those of who have attended workshops led by her in previous sessions sponsored by the center.

"There's definitely something for the novice as well as the experienced ultra-suede seamstress," she says.

The March 12 session will feature a demonstration of a technique that uses machine embroidery on ultra-suede for a unique look.

She will also discuss cut-out work

and how it can apply to ultra-suede. The method of sewing ultra-suede is somewhat similar to that used on leather goods. There is no glue involved in the method, but there are a few new accessory tools she recommends.

MRS. VANTREASE is a resident of Royal Oak who has taught all levels of tailoring, sewing, quilting and knitting in classes throughout the metropolitan area for the past 25 years.

She is regularly called upon to lecture on the subject or give demonstrations of what can be done with the luxury fabric.

Students will construct an eyeglass case in class and take home samples of seams, buttonholes, collars, cuffs, zippers and pattern selections.

Fee for the five hour session is \$13. Class space is limited so early registration is suggested by calling the center, 477-8404.
