THE TESTS present students with questions dealing with the types of occupations they may enjoy. Students are asked to consider if they prefer working with their hands, sitting at a desk or

ing with their hands, sitting at a desk or working outdoors. Clarification of their values, decision making and self awareness will be stressed through the program which will be open to students between noon and 3:30 p.m. daily. "We're not going to pick a job for the

kid," said Ms. Kuzma. "We will show them there are an unlimited number of occupations they could explore with self-knowledge." Information dealing with the different jobs will be fornished to the students via MOIS. The service has information to the self-knowledge. The service has information to the microfishe cards and available to schools. Such information as job opportunities, salary ranges, educational and entry level requirements. The service also details areas of the country in which there is a need for the occupation.

Teachers will be encouraged to incorporate relevant occupational information into their classes. Sessions in the career resource center will concent

IN ADDITION, persons who are working at white and blue collar jobs are invited to speak to different classes at the career resource center.

Ms. Kurma is also planning to institute a "shadow" program for the center which would allow students to follow persons in different jobs for a day. Since job hunting isn't the sale occupation of students, the resource center will be available to the public two evenings a month. At that time, the MOIS test can be administered to adults and a list of possible occupations can be suggested. The length of the list depends upon the age of the person, Ms. Kurma said.




