Looking for something to do this month? The library has a variety of offerings for everyone to help get through this often dreary season. School-agers are invited to join us to make box creations to be displayed at the library. We'll meet at 2 p.m., March 8. Bring a box, we'll supply everything else. At 2 p.m. March 22, films of Rudyard Kipling's "Rikki Tikki Tavi" and "Mowgli's Brothers" will be featured.

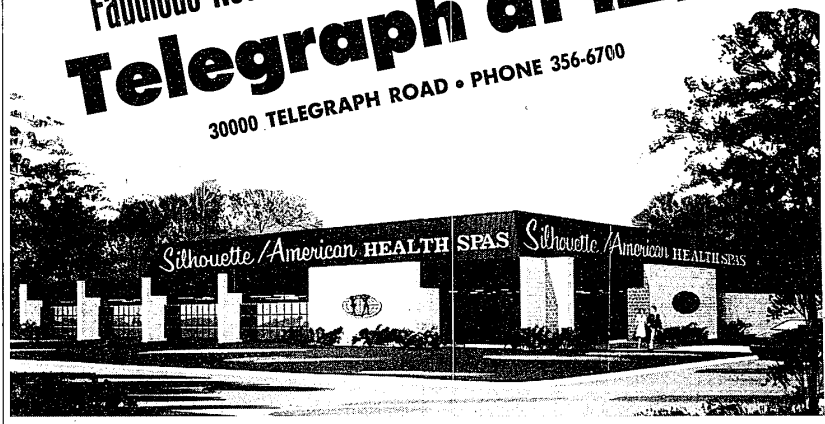
Mrs. Gasche is assistant

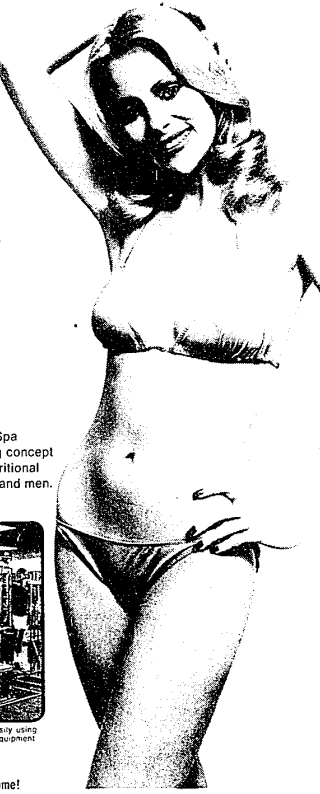
