

# Museum hosts lecture series

Four lectures sponsored by the educational department and the junior council of the Detroit Institute of Arts will offer additional insight to the new exhibit now being shown. It is "Old Master Paintings from the Collection of Baron Thyssen-Bornemisza" and this is its first United States tour.

At 8 p.m. on Thursday, March 27, Clifford Olds of the department of the history of art, University of Michigan, will speak on "Five Paintings from the Northern Renaissance and Their Significance for Detroit."

The final lecture in the series will be at 8 p.m. Thursday, April 24. Horst Uhl of the department of art and art history, Wayne State University, will give a program on "Nature into Art: Tradition and Innovation in Dutch painting of the 17th Century."

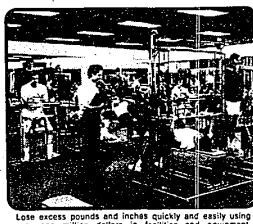
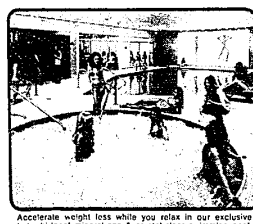
