

Stevenson upsets champs

The Spartans of Livonia Stevenson apparently believe in living dangerously on the basketball court during the state tournament.

But, then, at this stage of the tourney, every game gets tough.

Stevenson recorded one of its most satisfying wins of the season Tuesday, eliminating Detroit Mackenzie, 50-48, at the Livonia Franklin Regional. Mackenzie was defending Class A state champion.

The Spartans, which defeated Livonia Franklin by two points in the district final, never trailed Mackenzie after snapping a 4-4 tied five minutes into the contest.

Dave Hall, Stevenson's 6-foot-4 jack-of-all-trades, scored what turned out to be the winning points on a 20-foot jump shot from the key with 11 seconds remaining.

Hawk is top pick

Farmington Harrison's Brian Burgess was picked by Western Six League (WSL) basketball coaches as a member of the All-Conference first team.

Burgess, a 6-foot-2 senior forward, was Harrison's leading scorer this past season with a 15.8 average. He also collected eight rebounds per game, two assists and over two steals. He was one of the Hawks' co-captains.

"He got his name in quite a few places in our record book," Harrison coach Mike Teachman said of Burgess. Among those records was included second in total points in the school's history with 796, second in steals and fourth in rebounding.

He is the Harrison career leader in field goal percentage (52.4 percent).

"He is the consummate team player," Teachman said. "He was always taking the tough man on defense no matter what size he was."

Joining Burgess on the WSL first team was Tom Schaefer of Waterford Mott, a 6-1 senior; Dave Visser, a 6-5 senior from Plymouth Canton; Dave Ward, Northville's 6-6 junior; and Brian Kersten, a 6-3 senior from Livonia Churchill.

CANTON AND MOTT, the league's co-champions, had two players each on the second team. Canton selections were Scott Adler and Brad Weston, while Keith Hart and Dave Miller were chosen from Mott. Scott Parrish of Walled Lake Western was the fifth player named.

Honorable mentions included Mike Cleary of Harrison, Sean Houle of Canton, Mike Xenos of Western and Mike Wagner of Northville.

The Spartans played tough defense after that and Mackenzie took seven seconds to get the ball just over the midcourt line before calling time out. The Stags never attempted a shot which could have tied the game before time ran out.

The Spartans' defense was just too good. Stevenson's zone defense was excellent all night long. In fact, Kevin Roundfield, Mackenzie's 6-7 center, and one of its better scorers, collected only eight points — all during the fourth quarter.

"The key was us not letting them get the ball inside to Roundfield or (Dave) Traylor (also 6-7)," said Stevenson coach George Van Wagoner. "We knew they would be physical. They play that way in the city league."

The Stags started off like they would run Stevenson right out of the gym. Mackenzie totally controlled the boards during the first three minutes but just couldn't make its shots.

Mackenzie was stymied the entire game by the ball refusing to fall through the hoop, almost as if it had a mind of its own. The Stags must have had at least 10 close-range shots hit the rim, then bounce away.

Stevenson kept its poise during Mackenzie's early onslaught and built a 12-4 lead after the first quarter.

The teams matched points during the middle two periods, 14 and 16 respectively.

The Stags set a frantic pace during the entire fourth quarter and Stevenson appeared to tire under the pressure. The Spartans committed a turnover here and there, but never totally lost their bearings.

Stevenson used all of its allotted timeouts during the second half and used its last with 34 seconds remaining with the score tied at 48.

"We wanted to go to the four-corners, get the ball to Dave (Hall), clear out the forwards and let him go to work," said Van Wagoner. "The shot he took was a good shot for him. The kids kept their poise and worked the ball well."

The Spartans were exhausted after their thrilling victory. However, the effort certainly was worthwhile when nearly a hundred fans poured onto the court after the game to congratulate the men of the hour.

Hall and Bill Keyes were carried from the court on the shoulders of jubilant supporters.

"They wanted it," said Van Wagoner. "I think high-school kids are super kids. A lot of times we don't give them credit. I think everyone in there did the job."

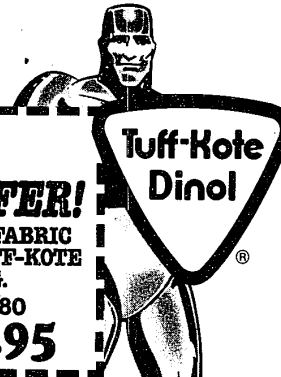
"I'm very proud of the kids," Van Wagoner continued. "Even the kids on the bench helped with their enthusiasm — no doubt about it."

Hall finished with 18 points. Evan Lyall chipped in nine, Tom Finn eight, Rich Sanders seven and Keyes six.
