Santa, along with Irish musicians, a barber shop quartet, Avery the Magician, and other entertainers will circulate among the three restaurants from 5 p.m. to midnight Monday.

Walters and waitresses in costume will offer Charley's shamrock cocktails and green grasshopper pie, along with other traditional Irish fare, beginning at noon in the restaurants.

THE OLD MILL in Waterford will be open from 5 p.m. until closing for a party on St. Patrick's Day.

Homemade Irish stew, corned beef and cabbage, boiled potatoes, green beer, green hummers and other Irish delights will be served.

To accompany the Irish festivities, Oakland University's Meadow Brook Estate will provide Irish ballads. For reservations, call 623-9300.

THE DETROIT PLAZA Hotel and WTRW Tower 92 will host a St. Patrick's Day party on Monday.

The celebration begins at noon in the Pylon on the Promenade Promenade Level of the downtown hotel in the Renaissance Center. Pat's People will sing Irish tunes until 3 p.m.
