space of time" to help blacks play catch-up in the system, he said.

The use of quotas to help blacks play catch-up is discrimination, according to Frontam. Quotas are a violation of the Civil Rights Act.

"And the law says you can't discriminate against any person." he said.

With quotas we are hurting some to help others, he said. And these actions are being perpetrated without any relevancy to the workers' situation, whether they be black or white.

Quotas serve to more 'blacks closer to the rich withes while other whites struggle," Fontham said.

"It is alsolutely unbelievable that people can say about minority groups, Be nice to individuals to make up to the race," he said.

That sort of system makes it appear that the mi-nority groups can't advance unless the federal gov-

norty groups can't advance uniess the federal government gives them a quota, he added.
