

Wesleyan Choir stops here on tour

The Illinois Wesleyan University Collegiate Choir, under the direction of Dr. David Nott, professor of voice and choral music, stops in Farmington First United Methodist Church for a performance during the groups five-state tour of the Midwest.

The choir will perform at 7:30 p.m. March 27 in the church at 3312 Grand River.

Nott came to Wesleyan from Simpson College in 1964. He spent 1973-74 as visiting professor and director of choral activities at University of Wisconsin where he supervised the university's master's degree program in choral conducting.

He is a bass soloist who has performed in the "Messiah" and has served as guest soloist with the Cantata Singers and on the Noon Day Recital Series in Columbia University.

Farmington Musicale scholarship competition applications available

Applications for Farmington Musicale's Scholarship Competition are available to students in seventh through 12th grades.

Students eligible for the competition must attend one of Farmington Public Schools, or a parochial or private school in Farmington or Farmington Hills.

The competition, set for Friday, April 18, is the 12th annual event of its kind given by the local musicle, which is an affiliate of Michigan and National Federation of Music Clubs.

Applications have already been distributed to the schools, but anyone unable to obtain one may call Fern Barber, 651-4604, for one to be sent on request.

Applications must be returned no later than Saturday, April 5.

This year scholarship will be awarded in piano, voice and instrument-

tal, as individual categories, on both junior and senior high school levels.

First place in the senior level will be \$125, and on the junior level, \$75.

Second place awards will also be available and will be given at the discretion of the judges.

CHAIRWOMAN of the event this year is Mrs. Barber who said, "The date of Friday, April 18, was selected to eliminate conflicts with Saturday morning college boards, which have plagued us in past years when we held the competition on Saturdays."

The competition will begin at 3 p.m. in Harrison High School Music Suite. The money for scholarships is always raised during the musicale's once-a-year rummage sale, "although contributions from members and friends are always welcome," Mrs. Barber said.


