What happens to the aging nun as she approaches or reaches retirement age?

Does she just "work until she dies?" That's the course many in the past have felt to be their calling. Or can she find a way to shift her heavier burdens to younger shoulders but still live a meaningful life with her or-der?

These are questions being considered in a two-week, first-of-its-kind workshop that will continue through this week on the Madonna Coilege campus.

Co-sponsored by Madonna and the University of Michigan Institute of Gerontology, the Workshop on Preparation for Retirement in Religius Communities is being conducted by Woodrow W. Hunter. co-director of the U.M institute and known as one of the top authorities in the country in working out programs for the aged.

PARTICIPATING are 41 sis-ters representing 23 separate orders and coming from 15 states and two Canadian prov-

"It's the first time we've conducted an intensive pro-gram of this kind for religious orders." said Hunter, who has worked closely with many businesses and labor unions to

set up retirement programs. His largest project in this area is a program for Chrysler Corp. and its United Auto Worker employes.

"The problems of the aging religious is different from that of the retired lay worker in many ways and similar in many," Hunter said.

"The lay retiree faces more bread-and-butter problems-being sure he has a place to live and enough to eat and medical care if he needs it.

DESCRIBING the nun's problems. Hunter said he was "stating a premise, because there's really been no research."

But we think that where "But we think that where the lay retireo has two sides to his life, work and family, the nun in the main has only her work. She has lived a life that is completely self-giving, and it may be hard for her to see why she must give up the work she has done.

She needs to be given op-portunities to go on living in a way that is meaningful to her We're trying to find satisfac-tory service substitutions for the work she has done. But we're just beginning.

"But we're just beganning."
