

Ten Mile School's classes brighten the night

The Farmington Public Schools' Community Education department once again sponsors a series of evening classes for adults beginning the week of March 24.

Registration can be completed before the first class period by mail at 10 Mile Community School, 32789 10 Mile, Farmington. In person registration can be accomplished from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. or from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. on Mondays through Thursdays at the school.

Mail registrants should plan to attend the first class. Further notification won't be sent to them.

Fees are payable at the time of registration. Refunds will be granted if classes are cancelled. All other requests for refunds must be made to the Community Education office before the second class meeting. A \$2 registration fee will be deducted in the case of withdrawal.

Farmington School district resident seniors who are older than 60 are eligible for free registration except in limited enrollment classes. Cards and identification numbers for the seniors are available at the 10 Mile Community School. They must be obtained before registration.

The following evening classes won't meet April 4 through April 13, spring vacation. Classes will meet for eight weeks at the 10 Mile Community School unless otherwise indicated.

SKILLS AND VOCATIONS

- Ground School for Private Pilot Rating, limited enrollment, from 7 to 10 p.m., Wednesdays for 10 weeks in room seven; \$30 fee; course covers the fundamentals of aircraft structure, aerodynamics, meteorology, pilotage, radio navigation. Includes preparation for Private Pilot FAA written examination. Students will receive a certificate upon successful completion of the course, to satisfy FAA requirements.
- Auto Maintenance & Repair, limited enrollment, from 7 to 10 p.m., Tuesdays, in room 107G of Farmington High School; fee, \$25; open shop, non-lecture for those who have completed previous automotive classes and wish to work on their cars. Individual instruction and demonstrations upon request.
- Know Your Car, limited enrollment, from 7 to 10 p.m., Wednesdays, in room 107G of Farmington High School; \$15 fee; this course designed primarily for persons who want to learn how and when to maintain their cars. Some trouble shooting experience.

- Upholstery, a limited enrollment course from 8:30 to 9:30 p.m., Mondays for 10 weeks in the basement of Farmington High School; learn the fundamentals of upholstery. Group demonstration and individual instruction. Tools and a large selection of materials can be purchased. Bring your chair the first night of class.
- Photography I, from 7 to 9 p.m., Thursdays for six weeks in room nine; \$16 fee; introduces camera fundamentals such as exposure, focusing, motion, depth of field, lenses and filters; two field trips.

- Photography II, from 7 to 9 p.m., Wednesdays for six weeks in room nine; \$16 fee; a serious discussion to the fine points of photography which include composition, lighting, special exposure problems, close-up photography, landscape photography and photographing people; two field trips included.
- Speed Reading and Comprehension Skills, from 7 to 9 p.m., Wednesdays in room 212B of Farmington High School; \$16 fee; designed to help individuals improve their reading rate, concentration, vocabulary and critical comprehension; class discussion, practice with visual aids, reading selections with comprehension checks.

- Drivers Education for Adults, a limited enrollment class for adults 18 years old and older; behind the wheel instruction in a dual controlled car. Individualized schedules will be arranged, call 477-1300, extension 26 for further information.

SPECIAL CLASSES

- Rent-A-Garden; a limited enrollment class in which members grow their own vegetables or flowers in a plot area. Plots will be available after May 1. Call the Community Education Office, 477-1300 extension 26 for further information.
- Elegant Handwriting (Calligraphy), a limited enrollment class from 7 to 9:30 p.m., Thursdays for six weeks in room three; \$15 fee; learn various scripts for writing creative invitations, announcements, poems and other lettered or printed pieces for functional or display purposes. (Materials fee is extra).

- Planning Your Estate, a limited enrollment course from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m., Wednesdays for 10 weeks in room five; \$25 fee; course designed for those persons or families with annual incomes in excess of \$30,000 or substantial assets. The purpose of the class is to discuss the importance of the laws of will and descent as well as the impact of federal estate, gift, inheritance, intangible and income taxes associated with it. Problems of probates, wills and trust instruments, distributions of property and reducing taxes through proper estate planning discussed. Several guest lecturers.
- Money Mystique, from 7 to 9 p.m., Mondays for four weeks in room 110E of Farmington High School; \$10 fee; topics considered include: stock market vs. money markets; bank interest vs. corporate bonds; whole life insurance vs. low cost pure protection; U.S. Series E bonds Treasury Bonds; cash value savings vs. mutual fund investing; importance of estate planning and setting up a living trust to avoid probate.

- Beginners Bridge (Goren) from 7-9 p.m., Mondays in room four; \$16 fee; course for beginners which covers hand counting, evaluation and bidding. Playing of hands interspersed with instruction to assist in absorption of instruction and to aid in gaining playing experience.
- Intermediate Bridge (Goren) from 7 to 9 p.m., Wednesdays in room four; \$16 fee; course in play of specially prepared hands for those with experience or beginners course. Play preceded by rapid review of bidding fundamentals; lead, play and defense instruction and instruction of certain bidding conventions.

- Close-up Magic for the Novice Adult, limited enrollment, from 8 to 9:30 p.m., Tuesdays for six weeks in room 10; \$15 fee; class limited to 10; little or no prior knowledge or skill in magic needed. Basic and simple sleight of hand along with misdirection will enable the student upon completion of course to entertain friends. Card effects, ropes, coins, silk and cigarette manipulations will be demonstrated. No special or expensive props will be employed since close-up and impromptu magic using ordinary household items will be taught.

- Theatre -- For the First Time; from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m., Tuesdays in room 405C; \$15 fee; no previous acting experience necessary. Students will try their hand at pantomim, stage directions, oral interpretation, characterization, improvisation.
- Treasure Hunting; beginners will learn how to put together a treasure hunt for their club, group or organization; how to develop clues, problem

solving techniques and strategies. Advance course will stress the problem solving techniques and strategies involved in more difficult hunts. Bring

notebook and pencil to class.

Beginners, March 25 and April 1; \$6 fee.

Advance, April 15 and April 22; \$6 fee; from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m., Tuesdays in room seven.

NOTICE TO CUT WEEDS

It shall be the duty of all owners of any subdivided land in any subdivision located within the boundaries of the City of Farmington Hills to destroy any noxious weeds growing on said property before they reach a seed bearing stage so as to prevent them from becoming a detriment to public health. Any weeds not cut by June 1, 1979, will be cut by the City and the owner of the property charged with the cost under provisions of the Farmington Hills City Code, Chapter 41, Section 41.120. This will be done as many times as necessary during the growing season. In addition any owner who shall refuse to destroy such noxious weeds as provided for in this City Code shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$100.00. Noxious weeds are those described in Section 2 of Act 359 of the Public Acts of 1941, as amended, and all other weeds, wild grasses and plants, the uncontrolled growth of which would constitute a nuisance.

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CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS CITY COUNCIL MEETING March 17, 1980

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills held a special meeting February 17, 1980 at 7:30 o'clock P.M. Mayor Soronen opened the meeting. Members present were: Burwell, Lange, Soronen, Wolf, Alkatieb and Oppertthauer. Dolan absent. Others present were City Manager Savage and City Attorney Donohue.

Council declared a necessity for dust control of all public paved roads in the City and set March 31, 1980 for the Cost Hearing date.

Land fill request was postponed.

Council introduced Amended Ordinance No. C62-198, SW 1/4 of Section 28, 23-226-045 and 046 on the NE corner of Drake and Freedom rezone from RC-2 to R-C2.

Council introduced Amended Ordinance No. C62-199 in the NE 1/4 of Section 3 on the W side of Orchard Lake Road, between Fourteen Mile and Ravine 23-3-226-011 to rezone from RCE to B-2.

C62-200 Amended Ordinance SW 1/4 of Section 35, 23-351-001 to rezone from RA-1 to RC-3 south of I-96, east of Tuck and north of Kensington Gardens Sub. was introduced.

Amended Ordinance C62-201, to rezone from GS-2 to B-3 parcel 23-11-351-013 in SW 1/4 of Section 11 located 27900 Orchard Lake Road, lot 38 of Oakland Hills Orchards was introduced.

Council introduced Amended Ordinance C62-B-8 amending the Farmington Hills Zoning Ordinance C62 to remove the RCE-1 Classification District and all use and area regulations pertaining thereto: Article VI-B, Article XVIII Section 1800 and 1801, Article XIX Section 1907, signs.

Upon motion meeting adjourned.
