LANGUAGE

- Spanish I (conversational) 7 to 9 p.m., Mondays, room nine, \$16 fee; designed to give students a knowledge of the fundamentals of conversational Spanish, for beginners.

• Microwave Cooking, limited enrollment; 7 to 9 p.m., Thursdays, for four weeks in kitchen; \$10 fee; materials extra; conserve time and energy while enjoying microwave cookery.

ARTS AND CRAFTS

• Adult Ceramics; limited enrollment; 7 to 10 p.m., Mondays, room one; \$25 fee, \$5 materials fee; freely structured class in basic ceramic techniques including hand-built and wheel-thrown methods. Emphasis on creative handling of the medium.

• Stained Glass Art I; limited enrollment; 7 to 10 p.m., Tuesdays, room nine; \$18 fee; materials fee; introduction to stain glass art with emphasis on design and construction of sun catchers, window and lamps; lead and copper foil methods.
