"If you do get card No. 231, the name on the front will be Steve McCatty. It will tell you that he is a pitcher for the Oakland Athletics.

Turn to the back and you'll learn that he is 8.760-13. weighs 200 pounds,

he is 6-foot-3, weighs 200 pounds, throws and bats right-handed and is from Troy, Mich. There will also be a statistical history of his baseball ca-

What you won't learn is how he was discovered, what it's like to play in Oakland and what it will be like to play for former Detroit Tiger and New York Yankee manager, and the Athletics' new one, Billy Martin.
McCatty, a 1972 graduate of Troy High School, will be starting his first full season as an Oakland A in April. It will also be the first time he will have a chance to impress his new manager, Martin.

"I think he'll help the club," McCatty said. "If someone makes mastakes, you can be sure he'll jump all over them."

IF TRINGS ARE the same this year for the A's as they were in 1979, Martin will have plient to jump about.

Oakland was dead last in the Western Division of the American League with a 54-108 record. They led the league in errors with 174, had the lowest team batting average at 239, and their pitching staff compiled the second worst earned run average (ERA) at 4.74.

McCatty was a bright spot in an otherwise dreary 1979 season. He had an 11-12 won-lost record with a 4.21 ERA. He was responsible for more than one-fifth of all the A's victories.

To prepare for the coming campaign, McCatty spent this past winter playing baseball in Puerto Rico for Ponce, a team managed by Manny Sanguillen, former Oakland catcher now playing for the world champion Pittsburg Prittsburg P

"Manny knows a lot," McCatty said.
