It's tornado safety week

Due to Michigan's location on the fringe of what is known as tornado al-ley and with its high urban population, Governor William Milliken has desig-nated this week as Tornado Safety Week.

A special committee is directing a statewide program which will involve state, county and local Emergency Services Coordinators and the National Weether Service.

Weather Service.

Michigan, compared to other states in recent years, has the third highest average number of tornado deaths per year with a total of 227 persons killed year with a since 1950.

During this time, 427 tornadoes occurred in the state. Most tornadoes occur in the months of April, May, June and July in the late afternoon and early evening, usually between 3 and 7 p.m. In homes, a basement offers the greatest safety during a tornado. Seek shelter under sturdy furniture. In homes without basements, take cover in the center of the house on the lowest floor in a small room such as a closet or bathroom. If you have time, open a window.

Mobile home dwellers should go to a prearranged substantial shelter during warnings. Motorists should travel at right angles to the tornado's path. If there is not time to drive away from it, get out of the vehicle into a basement, ditch or ravine — away from the vehicle.

AT WORK OR SCHOOL, follow advance plans to move to interior hallways or small rooms on the lowest floor. Avoid areas with glass and wide, freespan roofs. In open country, get into a sturdy building if possible, or lie flat in a nearby ditch or depression and hold onto something on the ground if possible.
