

Variety is the spice in daytime class offerings

The Farmington Public Schools' Community Education department again sponsors a series of daytime classes for adults beginning the week of March 24.

Registration can be completed before the first class period. Registration also can be completed at Ten Mile Community School, 32789 Ten Mile. The school is open from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m., weekdays and from 7 to 9 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Fees are payable at time of registration. Refunds will be granted when classes are cancelled. All other requests for refunds must be made to the Community Education office before the second class meeting. A \$2 registration fee will be deducted in the case of withdrawal.

Farmington district residents who are older than 60 years old are eligible for one free registration except in limited enrollment classes. An identification card and numbers for this free registration can be obtained at Ten Mile Community School. It must be obtained before registration.

All classes meet for eight weeks at the Ten Mile Community School and

begin the week of March 24 unless otherwise indicated. Babysitting for children 2 to 5 years old is available to parents enrolled in daytime enrichment classes at a charge of \$9 per eight week class. Refunds aren't made unless the class is cancelled.

The following classes are offered for daytime:

Special Interest

• Bridge, Intermediate (Goren) 1 to 3 p.m., Thursdays, room 4, \$16 fee; course in play of specially prepared hands for those who have had beginners course and/or playing experience. Play preceded by rapid review of bidding fundamentals; lead, play and defense instruction and instruction of certain bidding conventions.

• Dining Room Centerpiece, noon to 3 p.m., April 23, room 10, \$4 fee; custom made centerpieces using dried flowers, silks, artificial flowers will be made in this session. Materials will cost between \$15-\$20. Register by April 3 and the teacher will contact you about colors and container. See sample at Ten Mile School.

• Dried Flower Creations, 1:30 to 3:30 p.m., Tuesdays, room 10 \$10 fee, make four different accessories for your home or for gifts. Each week class completes an arrangement. Choice of colors. Arrangements: basket on board, match box or pencil holder, spring door piece (broom), filled egg crate. Materials fee \$6 to \$9 per item. Please see teacher's sample at Ten Mile School. This four week class begins April 1.

• Holly Hobbie Doll, handmade, this limited enrollment class meets from 1 to 3 p.m., Tuesdays, room 9, \$16 fee; sew a rag doll, about 30" long. Teacher provides materials with choice of color

and patterns. About \$10 in materials fee. Finished doll and clothes will be washable and ready for play or display. Most work done by hand. Some machine sewing is optional. Bring embroidery scissors, needle and thread. Teacher's display at Ten Mile School.

• Gardening, 10 a.m. to noon Wednesdays room 8, \$16 fee, basics of planning, planting a vegetable garden and basics of planting, dividing, pruning, feeding and grafting plants and shrubbery.

• Interior Design, 10 a.m. to noon, Thursdays, room 1, \$16 fee, demonstrations and field trips help solve home decorating problems. Basic design principles, color combinations, window treatments and consumer hints in purchasing fabric, carpet and furniture covered.

• Piano, Beginning Popular, 3 to 5 p.m., Mondays, room 10, \$20 fee plus books. Class presents enough basic notions so a person without previous musical education can recognize and apply note values to piano. Non-beginners will be offered chords. Class limited to 11. Piano books must be purchased.

Arts and Crafts

• Drawing and Sketching, limited enrollment from 10 a.m. to noon, Fridays, room one, \$16 fee. Exploration of drawing methods and materials with emphasis on composition and design. Bring 19-by-24 newsprint pad and soft pencils.

• Painting, Beginning and Intermediate, limited enrollment from 12:30 to 3 p.m., Tuesdays, room one, \$18 fee, students may use acrylics or oil. Painting techniques will be presented that are applicable to lighter media. Teacher will help with individual needs. Drawing helpful but not necessary. Students fur-

nish own supplies. • Watercolor Painting, limited enrollment from 1:30 to 3:30 p.m., Mondays room one, \$16 fee, learn basic watercolor techniques or advance skills. Bring tube watercolors, brushes, large water container, plant sprayer and watercolor paper for first class. Students work at own pace.

Business

• Accounting and Bookkeeping I from 10 a.m. to noon, Wednesdays room 7, \$18 fee, fundamentals of bookkeeping and principles of accounting procedures will be taught. Books sold at first class meeting, nine weeks.

• Accounting and Bookkeeping II and III from 9 a.m. to noon Tuesdays, room seven, \$18 fee, class continues accounting and bookkeeping I class. Same book used. Class starts March 31.

• Office Procedures limited enrollment from 1 to 3 p.m., room 2, \$16 plus materials. Total office procedures class designed to provide the student with review and skill development to function in an office. Students will work on business machines, dictaphone, business forms and filing, materials about \$5. Class starts March 31, limited to 12.

• Shorthand Refresher, 10 a.m. to noon, Fridays, room 2, \$16 fee, refresher course in Gregg Shorthand, brief forms reviewed, emphasis on building speed and transcription skills. Come prepared with notebook, etc.

• Typing, beginning, 1 to 3 p.m., Wednesday, room 2, \$16 fee; for those without previous typing instruction. Learn keyboard, including numbers and symbols. Some time devoted to building speed. Electric typewriters. bring paper.

• Typing Review, 1 to 3 p.m., Thurs-

days, room two \$16 fee; for those who know keyboard and wish to improve their speed accuracy; tabulation, business letters, simple reports and manuscripts covered. Electric typewriters, bring paper.

Sewing and Needlework

• Drapery Construction from 1 to 3 p.m., Thursdays, room 9, \$16 fee; students make sample size draperies, lined, unlined, sheer and swag with jabot. Teacher gives instructions on yardage, measurements, materials. Information on construction of cornices, roman shades and Austrian sheers also given. bring notebook to first meeting.

• Quilting, Introduction from 10 a.m. to noon, Thursdays room 9, \$16 fee; learn patchwork and applique quilting techniques, including hand and machine quilting. Projects include placemats, pillows, wallhangings, quilts. Bring scissors and thimble.

Cooking

• Chinese Cooking from 10 a.m. to noon, Wednesdays, kitchen, \$16 fee, Chinese instructor shows use of super-market items in making simple and nutritious meals. Dishes include snacks and appetizers as well as entrees. Materials fee, \$10.

• Gourmet European Cooking, from 1 to 3 p.m., Tuesdays, kitchen, \$16 fee. European instructor provides easy-to-prepare menus with accompaniments and serving suggestions. Planning, preparation and cooking methods for each meal will be shown together with history and background of the different dishes from Spain, France, Germany and Italy. All new recipes included \$10 materials fee due instructor at first session.

• Vegetarian Cooking, from 1 to 3 p.m., Wednesdays, kitchen, \$16 fee; teacher prepares European, Oriental

and North American vegetarian meals. Preparation, balanced diet emphasized. Information on sources for hard to find items will be included. \$8 materials fee due instructor at first session.

Dance and Fitness

• Zoroistic Fitness, 11 a.m. to noon, Tuesdays, gym, \$10 fee, develop cardiovascular functioning through exercise to music. Wear gym shoes and leotard or shorts.

• Danceexercise from 9:30 to 10:30 a.m., Tuesdays, gym, \$10, no experience necessary to join this class. Move to music, tone muscles, especially abdomen, hips, thighs. Come with shoes or rubber soles. No class April 15.

• Slimastics, from 10 to 11 a.m., Thursdays, gym \$10 fee; Shape up tired muscles while exercising with a group.

• Slimastics II from 11 a.m. to noon, Thursdays, gym, \$10 fee, for those who have finished Slimastics I.

• Volleyball, Ladies, 10 a.m. to noon, Fridays, gym, \$10 fee.

• Yoga, 10 a.m. to noon, Thursdays, room four, \$16 fee; improve posture, breathing and relaxation. Bring a mat or rug and wear loose clothing or leotard. Anyone with a history of back complaints should consult their doctor.

Children's Dance

• Ballet, beginning, 4 to 5 p.m., Thursdays, gym, \$12; this introductory class designed for 8-11-year-olds and includes warm up exercises, bat work, center floor exercises. Children will learn ballet basics and combinations with music. Suggested attire: body leotard and tights or loose clothes that don't confine movement, ballet shoes or heavy footies or socks.
