How to outfit kids for spring

Easter Parade and party clothes are back in the fashion forecast for children. The adult focus on getting all dressed-up again, of taking dressing seriously, has filtered down to youngsters who are eager to try out their new party manners.

Simpson advises a simple four-step plan to follow when spring cleaning children's closets.

First, separate the clothing into three categories, "Fine as is," "In need of repair" and "Discard."

The second step is to divide the remaining items into dress-up and casual categories.

Next, group the items by color and styling, considering all mix-and-match possibilities.

Fourth, purchase new items that coordinate with existing apparel to extend wardrobe capabilities.

WHEN SHOPPING, keep in mind that some of the season's freshest looks include sport coordinates that are color sliced and screen printed.

Poplin baseball jackets and carpenter shorts and overalls also reflect a child's active lifestyle. Coupled with activewear's colorful good looks are easy-care, machine washable separates in nylon, terry and knits.

For dress-up, girls' wear includes feminine sundering with gingham checks and floral prints, and smock and peasant-style dresses. Double knit three-piece suits in complementary heather and solid combinations dominate the boys' dress-up scene.

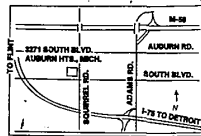
