Enrollment jumped from 65 the first year to 104 last September, with 150 students expected by September 1980. It is the fourth Lutheran high school in metropolitan Detroit. All belong to the Missouri Synod.

HER STAUNCH independence had its beginnings in her childhood on Detroit's east side and in Ham-tramck. It was during the Depres-

sion that she and her brother and sister learned to watch out for themselves and pull together. Their mother died when Mrs. Frizzelle was 8 years old and she remembers going to work at an early age to gain a better life for herself. She argues against government aid to people who can work.

"You take away incentive when


