A CENTRAL LEADER should be encouraged and the side branches should be pruned so they are at lease 4 inches apart. These dwarf fruit trees should give you a crop the second year. It would be wise to thin out the fruit the first year it produces, so it won't become stunder.

The standard fruit trees into production about 20 to 16 days after being in full flower, take to take forever to produce. About 12 to 16 days after being in full flower, take a sharp knife and score through the bark in a complete circle just below the lowest branch. The fruit crop will be increased the same year as well as the next year.
