

# Award winning artist offers 4 classes in center's next term

Award-winning artist Marjorie Chellstrop offers four classes designed to appeal to beginning or advanced art students during Farmington Community Center's spring term.

She believes that students of all levels of expertise can profit from the constructive criticism of the professional artist.

All classes are informal, and each is adapted to meet the needs of her students on an individual basis.

"As we share the art experience," she says, "the sociable atmosphere of the informal sessions encourage artistic stimulation."

On Mondays, beginning April 14, Mrs. Chellstrop teaches painting in oils and acrylics. The eight-session class runs from 9:30-11:30 a.m., and student explore composition and ways of handling either media.

Watercolor and drawing students gather from 12:30-3 p.m. for eight sessions, beginning Monday, April 14. In these sessions, the novice will learn basic skills, and the continuing student will delve further into the medium, plus resist and collage techniques.

Creative painting classes meet from 7:30-9:30 p.m. on Tuesdays, beginning April 15 for five sessions. Students are introduced to the medium of his or her choice: acrylic, oil, or watercolor.

Mrs. Chellstrop's drawing from life classes run from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. on Fridays, beginning April 18, and continue for five sessions. A live model assists in sharpening students' artistic abilities. No previous experience needed to succeed in the charcoal drawings class, Mrs. Chellstrop says.

THE ARTIST-teacher is an active member in the Farmington Artists Club and is a co-owner of Farmington's Garrett Gallery and Studios.

Mrs. Chellstrop's work is in both private and corporate collections. Some of her clients are Ford Motor Corporation, the Renaissance Center, Michigan Consolidate Gas, Campbell Ewald and Metropolitan Bank of Farmington.

She has garnered a host of awards and prizes in juried shows, both locally and nationally.
