

That motion was rejected 3-3. A sub-sequent motion to terminate Barlow and Evans was also rejected on a 4-2

Faced with the impasse, Lasher then proposed that the directive to termi-nate 11 teachers, three custodians and five administrators be changed to eight teachers, three custodians and three administrators. That motion was approved on a 5-1


