'Inside Passage' shown on series

The Community House in Birmingham concludes the season's Film Series at 8 p.m. Friday and Saturday, when Don Cooper will narrate his color film "Inside Passage and the Aleutian Islands."

Tickets are available in advance at The Community House, Bates and Townsend.

Viewers will share in the adventures of Don Cooper and his brother, Dennis, who buy an 18-foot cruiser and embark on a trip up the famed Inside Passage to Alaska and on up to the Pribilof Islands.

Cooper begins by heading northward from Puget Sound on up past Seattle to the Canadian Coast, where the massive rock cliffs are known as the most rugged stretch of coastline in the world.

COOPER'S FIRST encounter is with the Bella Coola Indians, a once-hostile race now known for its handsome and healthy appearance. Cooper tries his skill at salmon fishing and visits a family from this tribe, sharing in their daily chores and occupa tions.

Next, armchair travelers will visit Wrangell, Alaska, and the Haida Indian beauty queens, who still have full Haida blood. The Haida Indian totem poles made by the first generation are stand ing today.

Cooper embarks on his boat to explore the startling scenery of the

film

Alaskan fiords, where the tiny islands and multi-colored waters create an illusion of tranquil magnificence. Cooper heads north through the Alaskan fiords, and viewers feel a chill as Cooper explores Glacier Bay, the largest collection of major glaciers in the north, and a huge iceberg cave.

From Glacier Bay, the Coopers take their cameras to the breakup of Lake George. They wind up their trip with the Aleutian Islands and the Pribilof Islands.

Preceding the travel film program, The Community House will serve dinner, featuring Alaskan cuisine. Dinner is served by reservation only from 6 p.m. both days. Dinner reservations can be made by calling The Community House, 644-5832.
