SEMTA also receives federal funds and part of a 10 percent share of state gasoline and vehicle registration taxes. That 10 percent portion of the state highway fund, for public transportation statewide, was approved by voters in November 1978.

If Murphy decides to begin petition-ing for a referendum, it probably won't happen this year, Niemann said, be-cause too many questions remain unanswered on what the transit plan will cost and what the operating deficit will be

will be.
The plan must be approved by the federal Urban Mass Transportation Authority (UMTA), which has the final say on the region's receiving an estimated \$900 million for capital. Murphy has said UMTA won't approve capital financing of the plan until SEMTA shows how it will cover the expected operating deficit.
