Computers make medical inroad

If you thought hospital laboratory technicians spent all their time glued to microscopes examining plates of blood, body fluids or tissue samples under high-powered lenses, you might be surprised.

Highly sophisticated computerized equipment has replaced the microscope in the modern hos-pital laboratory. And todays lab technician must be trained in chemistry and biology as well as mechanics in order to maintain the quality of their instruments.

"The challenge now is to understand the machinery," said Michelle Strait, pathology supertwos for Henry Ford Hospital's West Bloomfield
Center on Maple Road west of Drake Road.
"Once a day every instrument undergoes a
performance check, and technicians must know
to fix them."

Ms. Strait conducted a tour through the Center's lab, which opened in late 1975, as part of National Medical Laboratory Week (April 13-19)

LAST YEAR, the 13-person staff performed bout 108,000 laboratory procedures, according

about 106,000 laboratory procedures, according to Ms. Strait.
She said the facility is open 24 hours, handles all the work generated by the Ford clinic and is also available to outside area physicians.
Registered medical technician Judy Shipley, who performs at least 150 blood tests per day, explained just how advanced the equipment has

explained just how advanced the equipment has become.

"It takes about 45 seconds to do a che (complete hieod count) on this machine, she such adjusted to the second count) of this machine, she such adjusted to the same test manually on a microscope would take 25-30 minutes."


The coulter was invented about 20-years ago, according to Ms. Shipley.
