

Don't knock our youth, they're aware, generous

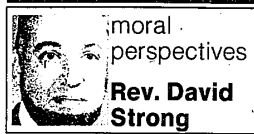
I am astonished at the results of a hunger drive organized by a group of senior high youth. More than \$1,000 has been raised for world hunger by the youth-initiated starvation.

I am particularly thrilled to realize that the same group of youth have initiated such a world hunger drive for three successive years, each time raising more money.

Many adults have a rather negative attitude toward the younger generation. They speak of the problems youth bring with them: drugs, laziness, lack of respect. Seldom do I hear the older generations praising and valuing the young. It is about time that we tune in and appreciate their strengths and their promise for the future.

COMPARED to the older generations I know, our youth have a deeper awareness and affinity for the issue of world hunger. Is it that the older generations are still emotionally tied to the issues which surrounded the Depression, or the Second World War?

I see youth who ask pertinent questions: Will there be food enough? Will there be energy, and private automobiles in our adult life? Will there be a world? Or will it be destroyed in a nuclear war? These are some of the questions which need to be

asked. I find that there is evidence that the majority of our youth are not "burn outs" but persons full of concerns and ideals.

I KNOW YOUTHS who are willing to give of themselves and their efforts far beyond what most adults are willing to do. Year after year they are enthusiastic about work camps, giving their efforts and their money and they are willing to risk new and difficult relationships for the purpose of helping others.

We who work with young people today need to have our appreciation for them and our faith in the strengths and even in the weaknesses of the rising generations who are the promise of the future.

Seminar will aid diabetic youths

An all-day seminar designed to help young diabetics work out individual lifestyles will run 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, May 3 in Brighton High School.

Sponsored by the American Diabetes Association, it will be the second such seminar given in the state. Young people over 10 and their parents are invited to participate.

"Diabetics who are 10 to 18 are really pretty much on their own," said Robin Delp, who helped design the seminar. She added that is especially true for girls who are going through hormonal changes.

"It's very hard to generalize when there are so many variables in just growing up," she said, "and it is very important for these young people to be attuned on a pretty regular basis."

Talks with doctors and nurses, films, workshops, exercises and rap sessions all are part of the day to be called "Juvenile Diabetes - Let's Talk about It."

Lunch is included in the fee of \$4 for the first registrant in a family. Additional family members may attend for \$2.

"TALKING about it is probably the most valuable thing we can do," Ms. Delp said. "Talking with those who have gone through or are going through the same thing you are is the best support a diabetic can have. If the parents understand this, so much the better."

The young woman who is now director of youth education and activities for the American Diabetes Association-Michigan Affiliate was diagnosed as a diabetic when she was 11 years old. "I rebelled and resisted against it with everything I had," she said, "so I have a special empathy for these kids."

Registration blanks will be sent upon request by calling the diabetes Michigan headquarters at 343-9333.

A complete agenda of the day's activities will be sent on return, along with a map directing participants to Brighton High School.
