Through the use of a Through the use of a specially equipped van, the Mount Carmel team will assist the patient's own physician in remov-ing the pancreas, process-ing it and removing the islet cells for re-implan-tation, thus eliminating diabetes in the patient.

The pancreas trans-The pancreas trans-plant program further of-fers the patient with ju-venile onset diabetes an alternative to chronic in-sulin therapy, and hope-fully, prevent the morbi-dity and premature mor-tality associated with this disease

Once successful, the 1.6 million patients now suf-fering from juvenile dia-betes will have an alter-native to chronic insulin therapy. The impact will be reflected upon the de-lay, or elimination, of secondary complications, such as blindness or renal failure.
