

Centaur netters top Troy RC

It was the battle of the Detroit Metropolitan Area indoor tennis giants, and Centaur was the victor.

In winning, the club erased all doubt of its place as the strongest men's club tennis team in the area.

The showdown match materialized when the Centaur Racquet Club of West Bloomfield accepted a challenge from the Troy Racquet Club of Troy. Centaur then defeated the challengers, 201-182.

One wonders just how good the adult club from West Bloomfield, as it stays undefeated in Suburban Tennis League action for the second consecutive year.

The Troy squad is easily leading the Metro Tennis League. After downing all the competition in its league by wide margins, the Metro leaders sent a challenge to the Centaur Club and invited the Suburban front-runners to a challenge match in Troy.

The special event included 16 men's singles matches and eight men's doubles matches rather than the usual eight singles and four doubles matches.

The most exciting match of the evening took place in the No. 1 singles spot when Dan Conger of Centaur narrowly defeated former Big-Ten Champion from the University of Michigan, Dan McLaughlin of Troy, 12-10, in a long match that was not decided until the last point of the final game.

THE CENTAUR contingent supported Conger's win by defeating Troy's next six top players. When the 16th singles match had been completed, and Centaur was ahead by 14 points.

Centaury's Harvey Miller was the only player to shut out his opponent,

defeating Bob Bouts of Troy, 12-0.

Centaur won five of the eight doubles matches, adding to its total of 201 points.

Many of the best players have not played in any of the league matches, and some of the stronger players have not competed in any one match, together, so far this year.

In talking with Mike Mehas, Centaur's manager, I found that he purposely does not play the strongest players in some of the matches in order to give a greater number of club members an opportunity to participate in league competition.

It doesn't seem to make any difference whom he plays - the club just goes on winning.

Area netter shines in Ohio

Pat Segrue of Farmington has earned his second varsity swimming letter from Bowling Green State University in Bowling Green, Ohio.

A sophomore freestyler, Segrue helped Bowling Green compile its best dual-meet record (9-4) in 16 years during the 1979-80 season. The team established 13 records, 11 coming in the Mid-American Conference championship, in which Bowling Green placed fifth.

Three of those records belong to at least in part to Segrue. He set one record in the 500-yard freestyle with a time of 4:44.30, good for sixth place in the MAC meet.

He also joined teammates Jeff Wolf, Ed McCoy and Matt Lenhart on the 400-yard freestyle relay team which set a school record of 3:35.59. The 800-yard freestyle relay (Segrue, Wolf, Lenhart and Jim Gleason) logged a record 7:00.11. Both records were set in the conference meet.

Segrue finished eighth at the MAC meet in the 1650-yard freestyle in

16:45.81, and was 11th in the 200-yard freestyle in 1:44.5.

Segrue, a graduate of Detroit Catholic Central High School, was one of Bowling Green's top point producers during the dual-meet season in the distance freestyle events.
