Great Scott Supermarket Chairman Jack Rikman has extended a voluntary price freeze on 100 private label food items through Wednesday, May 7.
Rikman, chairman of 35 metro area Great Scotts including the store at 13 Mile and Orchard Lake roads, was lauded by President Carter last month. The Farmiggion Hills resident was one of 25 national supermarket chain-leaders invited to the White House and honored for complying with a voluntary freeze suggested by Esther Peterson, special assistant for consumer affairs, last Marcy good meeting," Rikman said. 
"The president was most cordial. He realized our efforts alone would not lead to a control of inflation but (the receip was in the national interest. He was very appreciative of that."

Following the first 30-day period, A&P. Parmer Jack and Meijer discontinued their price freeze programs. Chatham extended its program through April. told the group.


