

# WB wins net tourney, blanks rivals in dual meets

West Bloomfield rebounded from a shutout loss to Birmingham Brother Rice a week ago to record a pair of dual meet shutouts and a win in the Rochester Adams tennis tournament during the past week.

The Lakers ran up scores of 7-0 over Bloomfield Hills Lahser Friday and Milford, their first GreaterOakland Athletic League meet, on Monday.

On Saturday, West Bloomfield

netters won five of seven events to capture top honors in the Adams tournament. The Lakers scored 24 points, Adams had 20, Lake Orion 10 and Lapeer West finished with two.

Ed Nagel, a freshman, lost only two games for West Bloomfield in his first singles matches over the weekend. He beat Ed Havel of Lahser, 6-1, 6-0, and Mauro Basso of Milford, 6-0, 6-0, in dual meets, and whipped Paul Shrock of Adams, 6-1, 6-0, to win the Adams first singles championship.

Brad Stevens won all three events in second singles, beating Lahser's Craig Lee, 6-4, 6-4, and Milford's Pat Kinstle, 6-1, 6-0. At the Adams' tourney he was a 6-1, 7-5 victor over Rex Gustafson of Lake Orion.

DAVE BERNE played third singles Friday against Lahser and came out a 6-1, 5-2 winner over Bob Weiman. Berne returned to fourth singles Saturday and topped Bruce Wolwend of Lake Orion to win the title, 6-0, 6-0. Against

Milford, he bested Greg Ginnard, 6-0, 6-0.

Jeff Greenberg was third singles champ at Adams, defeating Gary Babian of Adams in the finals, 6-1, 6-0. Greenberg ripped Bob Morin of Milford, 6-0, 6-0, in Monday's meet.

The second doubles team of Mike Brown and Scott Vandorn beat Adams' Steve Kreszski and Tim Beghian, 6-3, 6-1, to win that division at the Adams event. The team also won first doubles against Lahser, downing Bob Nau and

Mike Pirlich, 6-3, 4-6, 6-3.

Against Milford, Brown and Vandorn returned to second doubles and won over Jim Lauridsen and Dean Leiros, 6-0, 6-0.

Brian Bailey and Howard Eischenstadt teamed to win third doubles in both the Lahser and Milford meets. They bested Marc Klymen and Craig Pura of Lahser, 6-4, 6-3, and won out over Dean Rodenard and Dennis Deppner of Milford, 6-0, 6-0.

The Lakers are now 2-1 overall and 1-0 in the G.A.L. They host Clarkston Friday at 4 p.m.

The Vikings, expected to challenge for the Inter Lakes League (ILL) crown in preseason projections, took a step in the wrong direction Friday by dropping a 6-1 decision to defending ILL champ Livonia Stevenson.

Stevenson's Glenn Gwanda set the tone for the meet by beating Doug Gruber in first singles, 6-1, 6-1.

It didn't get any better after that. Scott Boone, in third singles, and Greg Boone, in fourth singles, were both victims of shutouts (6-0, 6-0).

Rob Kamenoff was Central's only winner, taking the second singles by a 6-2, 6-1 margin over Stevenson's Larry Shoff.

The win gave the Spartans a 3-0 ILL record while Central, 3-3 overall, fell to 1-2 in the league. The Vikings host Milford Lakeland Friday at 4 p.m.
