

Outstate teams top WB Meet

Kalamazoo Loy Norrix won five events, including four relays, to finish first with 95 points last Saturday in the seventh-annual West Bloomfield boys' track invitational.

Flint Northern, the state Class A defending champion, placed second with 84 points, and Ann Arbor Pioneer was third with 69. Milford Lakeland finished fourth with 38 points, West Bloomfield had 35, Birmingham Seaholm 35, Oak Park 31, North Farmington 18, Brighton 17, Clarkston 14, Warren Lincoln 10, Walled Lake Central six and Warren Woods four.

"Local teams didn't do that badly when you consider that Loy Norrix has lots of good people, Flint Northern is the defending state champ and Pioneer is up this year," said West Bloomfield coach Lee Averill.

Outstanding performer awards were

given to Lakeland's Rick Jones and Clarkston's Steve Wyckoff. Jones established a meet record of 56-feet-5 1/2 in winning the shot put, and Wyckoff tied a meet standard in the high jump with a 6-foot-7 effort.

Scott Harper of Birmingham Seaholm was the meet's only double winner in the individual events, taking the mile run with a meet-record 4:23.4 and the two-mile run in 9:35.4.

West Bloomfield's Dan Kenwell had an outstanding day, winning the discus throw in 152-7, and taking second place behind Jones in the shot put with a 55-5 1/2, also a meet record.

Another North trackman, George Houtekier, finished fourth in the shot put with a toss of 50-5.

"As a team, we missed the boat on several events," said North Farmington assistant coach Ed Davis. "The competition was tough, but we should have scored in two or maybe three other events."

Other local finishers included Cen-

tral's Bob Goings (third place in the shot put at 20-1) and Seaholm's Jim Roth (third place in the pole vault at 15-0).

On Saturday, May 3, West Bloomfield will host its girls' track invitational. The 30-team field includes powerhouses Pontiac Central, Brighton and Rochester. The meet begins at 10 a.m.

County plans golf tourney

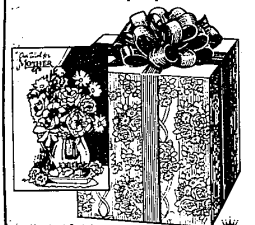
Oakland County's annual Two-Man Best Ball Golf Tournament will take place on a Saturday, May 10, at Springfield Oaks Golf Course in Davison.
