## Learning disabled topic of family conference

A one-day family oriented workshop will focus on children with learning disabilities.

The meeting, sponsored by the Detroit, Southfield, Birmingham and Royal Oak chapters of the Michigan Association for Children with Learning Disabilities, will open at 8:30 a.m. at the Shrine Elementary School at 12 Mile and Woodward in Royal Oak.

Registration begins at 8:30 a.m. and the meeting will conclude at 5 p.m.

Most conference sessions will be one hour and 15 minutes in length. Morning and afternoon coffee breaks at a 1 p.m. lunch break are planned.

Participants are invited to bring a bag lunch to the Shrine School's cafeteria where coffee and tea will be provided. Numerous restaurants are nearby as well.

Scheduled topics include Communication Skills: Helping the L.D. Child with Speech and Language Problems; Coping Skills for Parents of L.D. Children; Mainstreaming; Employment Opportunities; College Opportunities; Vocational Rehabilitation; and Advocacy.

A number of specialists and experts will participate in the conference and ray sessions for fathers and sons, a young adult rap and many other sub-topics are scheduled.

Speakers include Dr. Fran Eldis and Beverly Viedrah, language pathologists; Richard Jackson, co-ordinator of programs for the Michigan Department of Education, CETA; Willard Walker, Bureau of Employment and Training; and consumer advocate, Len Sawisch, for vocational rehabilitation.

Cost of the meeting is nominal and special fees will be charged to students.
